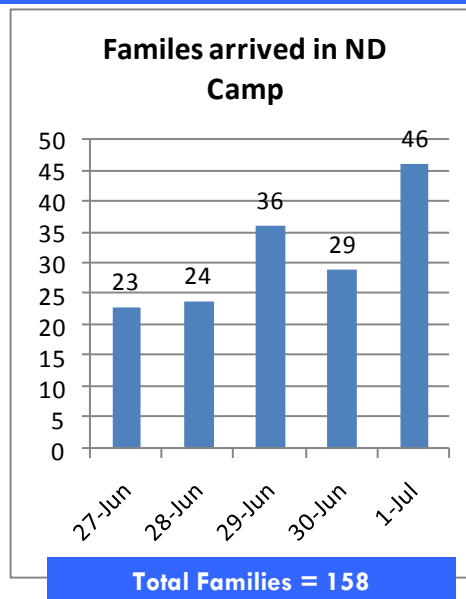

## KURRAM LATEST

### Situation at New Durrani Camp—Lower Kurram Agency

IDPs families from Central Kurram Agency continue to arrive in the camp. IDPs are accommodated in tents, and provided cooked food and medical assistance.

- OPD is operational by the Agency Surgeon and patients IDPs are provided with immediate first aid and medicines.
- The IDPs are provided cooked food with support of Town Committee Sadda, and Political Administration. The cooked food contains rice, vegetables, curry and bread.
- Clean drinking water is provided through water tankers by Public Health Engineering Department, FATA.
- Initially, UNHCR provided 200 tents and 200 NFIs. FDMA further arranged for 500 tents and 1,000 NFIs. These new tents/NFIs will be dispatched and reach the camp by Sunday afternoon.



### Gaps & Actions

#### Gaps

**TENTS:** 225 tents have been erected, and there are no more un-pitched tents left at the camp.

**NFI:** 60 out of 200 NFIs have been distributed among the registered IDPs. The NFIs are just enough for current population in camp, however at least 500 NFIs are immediately needed.

**FOOD:** Currently, cooked food is provided by local administration. Their resources will exhaust in next few days, as influx continues.

**WASH:** There are no wash facilities available what so ever. 1,000 wash facilities are needed on immediate basis

**HEALTH:** Medicines and health facilities are needed for 500 families

#### Actions

FDMA has arranged for 500 tents out of its own resources. The tents will arrive latest by Sunday afternoon. These additional 500 tents will be enough for the IDPs coming to the camp for the next two days, after which more tents will be needed because a large influx of IDPs is expected to occur.

FDMA has arranged for 1,000 NFIs out of its own resources. These NFIs will reach latest by Monday morning, as they are transported from DI Khan.

FDMA has requested UNHCR to hire a local Implementing Partner to provide cooked food to the IDPs in camp.

UNICEF has been contacted for provision of the said facility

WHO has been requested to provide for Emergency Health Kits.

## Immediate Relief Items Needed

It is expected that approx. 6,000 to 8,000 families will be displaced due to the current operation in Central Kurram. The Government is providing relief assistance to all IDPs arriving in newly established camp. However, the need is far more than the capacity of local government offices.

Currently, FDMA and Political Administration is coping with the situation very well, but the resources will be exhausted soon. FDMA has already filed relief appeal with humanitarian agencies.
