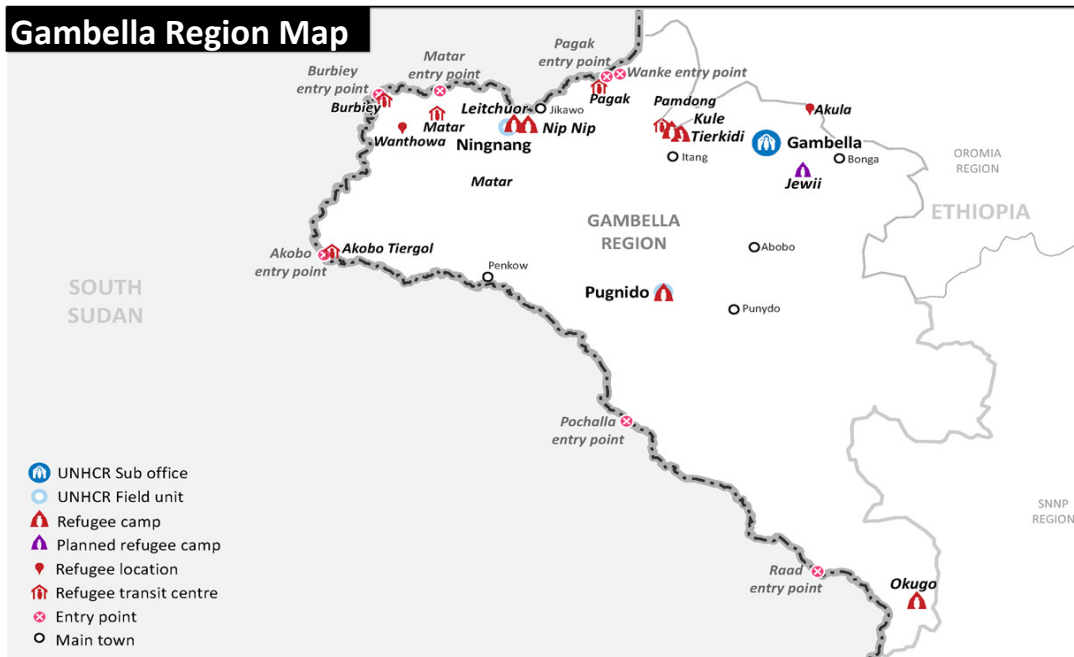


# South Sudanese new arrivals in Gambella - Post 15<sup>th</sup> December 2013 (as of 24-April-2015)

## Gambella Region Map

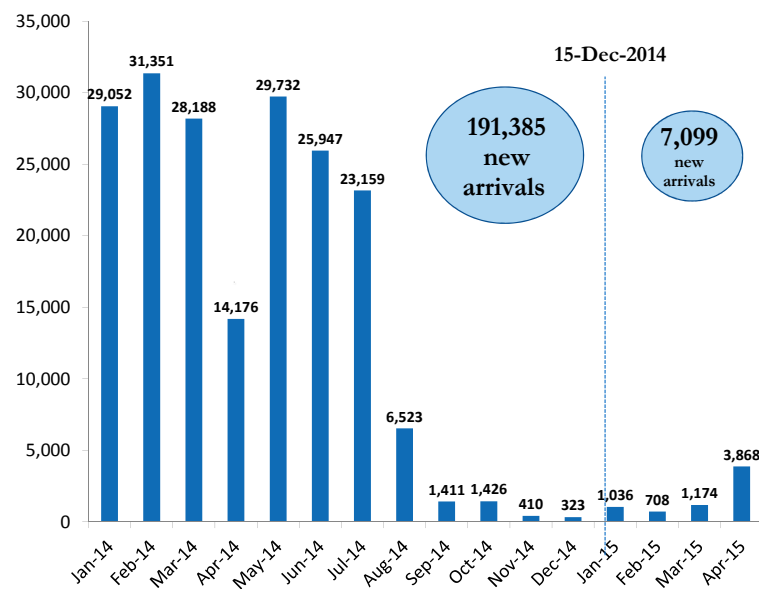

In addition to 198,484 South Sudanese refugees in Gambella region, there are 8,978 refugees at the camps in Assosa [Breakdown: Pre 15th Dec 2013 = 6,161; Post 15th Dec 2013 = 2,817]

\*\* - This figure does not include the old caseload of 10,000 South Sudanese refugees living in Wanthowa Woreda who arrived pre-15 December 2013.
