













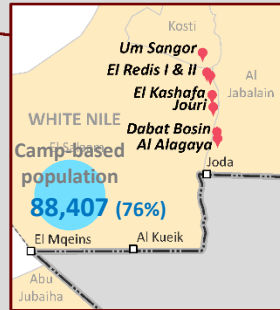
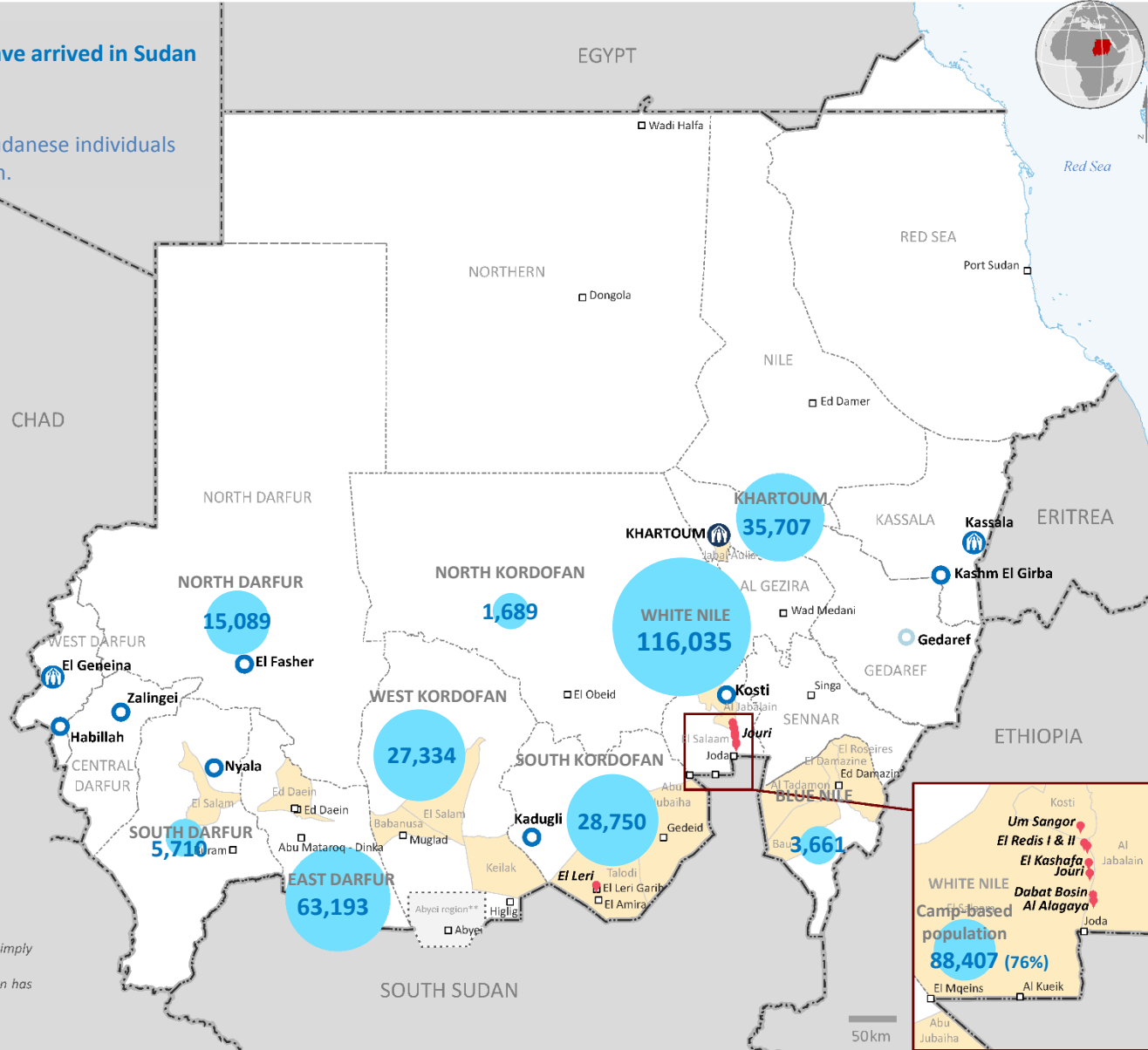
# SUDAN: Refugees from South Sudan | 31 December 2016

Over **297,168** South Sudanese refugees have arrived in Sudan since December 2013

Sudan also hosts an estimated 350,000 Southern Sudanese individuals following the separation of South Sudan from Sudan.
