


OVERVIEW

41m people affected in three countries (millions)

As a result of torrential monsoon rains, almost 41 million people have been affected by flooding and landslides in Bangladesh, India and Nepal. At least 900 people are known to have died. Tens of thousands of houses, as well as schools and hospitals, have been destroyed leaving people displaced and in urgent need of life-saving support. There is the possibility that the situation could deteriorate further as rains continue in some flood-affected areas and flood waters move south.

The governments in all three countries are leading the response with support from in-country humanitarian agencies, national Red Cross/Red Crescent Societies, private sector and militaries. However, many areas remain inaccessible due to damage to roads, bridges, railways and airports.

In Bangladesh, the government is providing cash and food to flood affected people, and 1,945 local medical teams have been deployed. A needs assessment has been conducted and findings are informing discussions between the Clusters and the national counterparts to identify gaps to be filled by the international community.

Rescue operations are ongoing in many flood-affected areas, with those stranded being rescued by helicopter. Flood relief camps have been established for those displaced by the disaster where they are being provided with food and shelter. The number of camps is increasing as the flood-affected area continues to expand. The Prime Minister announced a package of 20 billion Indian rupees for relief, rehabilitation, reconstruction and flood mitigation.

The Government of Nepal has welcomed assistance from other governments, organizations and individuals. As of 21 August, \$16.2 million has been committed or pledged to the flood response. The government, UN agencies, NGOs and others are working together to provide people with food, health services, non-food items and hygiene kits amongst other assistance.
