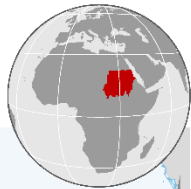


# SUDAN: Arrivals from South Sudan | 15 December 2013 – 22 April 2015













Over **133,626** persons have arrived in Sudan from South Sudan

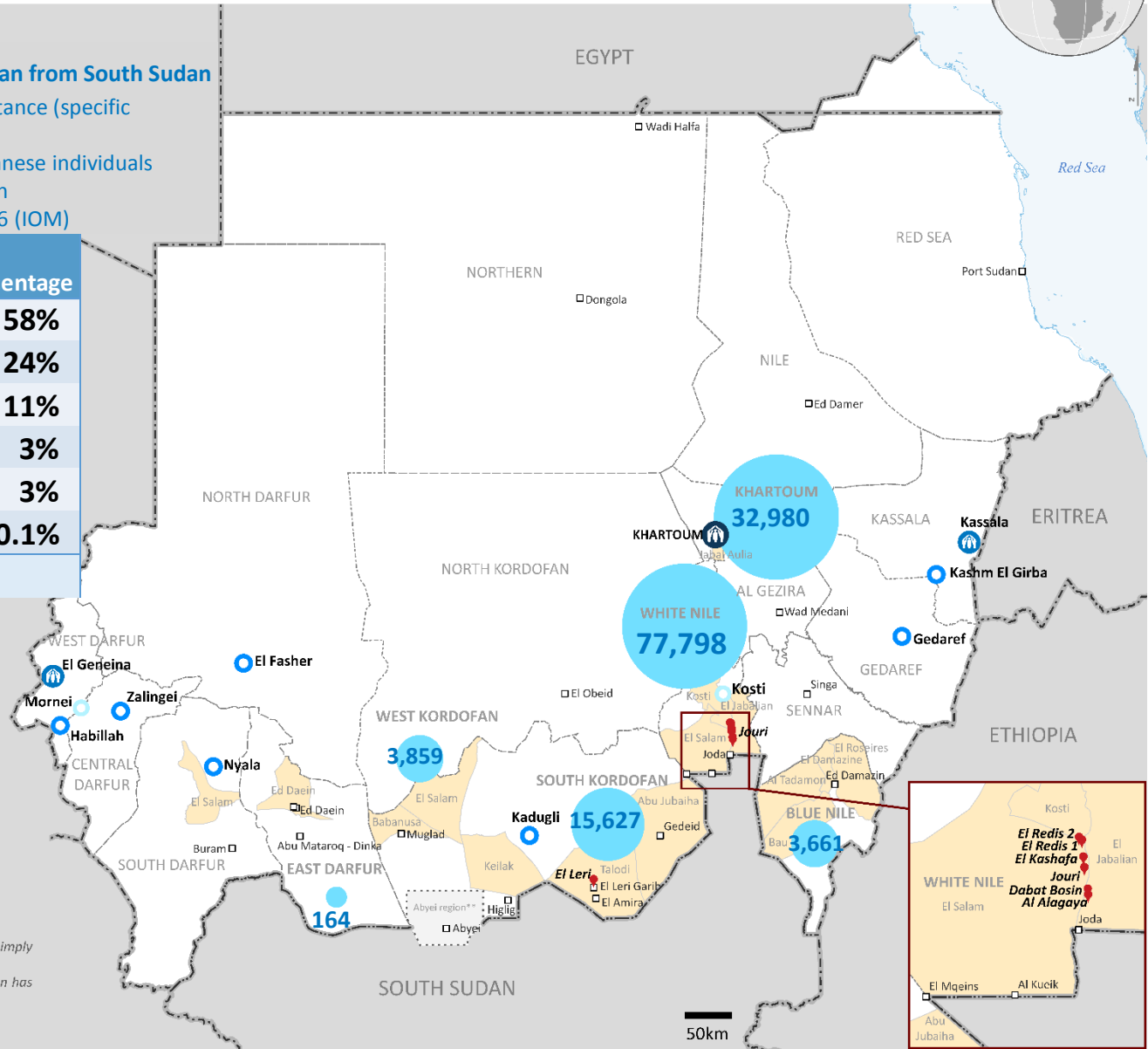
- 78,214 persons have received humanitarian assistance (specific assistance only)
