SUMMARY OF IMPORTANT EVENTS AS ON 15.07.2013

RAINFALL/FLOOD SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY

Rain/thundershower has occurred at most places over Madhya Pradesh , Vidarbha, Odisha, Telangana and along west coast; at many places over Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, south Uttar Pradesh, east Rajasthan, Gujarat region, Chhattisgarh, coastal Andhra Pradesh, Marathwada, Madhya Maharashtra, interior Karnataka, northeastern states and Andaman & Nicobar Islands: at a few places over Jammu & Kashmir, Haryana, Saurashtra & Kutch and Jharkhand and at one or two places over rest parts of the country outside west Rajasthan and Rayalaseema where weather remained mainly dry. The chief amounts of rainfall (2 cm or more) recorded at 0830 hours IST of today were : Nagpur-15,Gondia-13 and Rajnandgaon-13 each; Panchmari and Una-12 each; Port Blair-8; Bramhapuri-7; Malanjkhanda-6, Rajgarh, Jabalpur, Khandwa, Silchar, Dharamshala, Sawai Madhopur and Nizamabad-5 each; Imphal, Shirali, Baroda, Jalgaon and Khajuraho-4 each and Rewa, Betul, Seoni, Mahabaleshwar, Honavar, Agumbe, Mangalore, Darjeeling, Guwahati, Churk, Harddoi and Banda-3 each.

Indian Meteorological Department (Major features of weather forecast)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at most places along west coast, central India and Andaman & Nicobar Islands.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, east Rajasthan, Gujarat State, east & north east India.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over Punjab, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh and coastal Andhra Pradesh.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at one or two places over rest parts of the country.

CENTRAL WATER COMMISSION (daily water levels and forecasts for level forecast sites)

- There are 13 moderate flood situation sites in the country as on 15.07.2013.

DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF)

30 teams of NDRF consisting of 1098 personnel have been deployed in Assam (5), West Bengal (2), Sikkim (1), Maharashtra (3), Gujarat, J & K (4), Himachal Pradesh (2), Uttarakhand (7) and Bihar (6).

INDIAN METEOROLOGICAL DEPARTMENT (daily weather report)

- Rain/thundershowers would occur at most places along west coast, central India and Andaman & Nicobar Islands.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at many places over Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, east Rajasthan, Gujarat State, east & north east India.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at a few places over Punjab, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh and coastal Andhra Pradesh.
- Rain/thundershowers would occur at one or two places over rest parts of the country.

Warning

- **15 July:** Heavy to very heavy rainfall would occur at one or two places over Odisha, Madhya Pradesh and Vidarbha. Heavy rainfall would occur at one or two places over Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, west Uttar Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, coastal Andhra Pradesh, coastal Karnataka and Andaman & Nicobar Islands.
- **16 July:** Heavy to very heavy rainfall would occur at one or two places Odisha, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Vidarbha. Heavy rainfall would occur at one or two places over Konkan & Goa, coastal Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, coastal Karnataka and Andaman & Nicobar Islands.
- **17 July:** Heavy to very heavy rainfall would occur at one or two places over Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Vidarbha. Heavy rainfall would occur at one or two places over Konkan & Goa, Telangana, coastal Karnataka and Andaman & Nicobar Islands.

Weather outlook for next four days

- Rainfall would continue at many places over Gangetic plains, west coast, central, east & northeast India.
- Isolated to scattered rainfall activity would continue over many parts of the country

CENTRAL WATER COMMISSION (daily water levels and forecasts for level at forecast sites)

According to the Central Water Commission (CWC) report dated 15th July, 2013, there are 13 Moderate flood situation sites in the country.

- River Dhansiri (S) at Numaligarh, district Golaghat/ Numaligarh, Assam is flowing at 77.48 m against the danger level of 77.42 m with Falling trend.
- River Jiabharali at Jiabharali(NTX), district Sonitpur, Assam is flowing at 77.15m against the danger level of 77.00 m with Rising trend.

Bihar

- River Bagmati at Benibad, district Muzaffarpur/Hayaghat, Bihar is flowing at 48.90 m against the danger level of 48.68 m with Falling trend.
- River Kosi at Basua, district Supaul, Bihar is flowing at 47.82 m against the danger level of 47.75m with Falling trend.
- River Mahananda at Dhengraghat, district Purnia/Bayasi, Bihar is flowing at 36.26 m against the danger level of 35.65 m with Steady trend.
- River Mahananda at Jhawa, district Katihar/Jhawa, Bihar is flowing at 32.36 m against the danger level of 31.40 m with Falling trend.

Uttar Pradesh

- River Ghaghra at Elgin Bridge, district Barabanki, Uttar Pradesh is flowing at 106.30 m against the danger level of 106.07m with Rising trend.
- River Ghaghra at Ayodhya district Faizabad/Ayodhya, Uttar Pradesh is flowing at 92.78 m against the danger level of 92.73 m with Falling trend.
- River Ghaghra at Turtipar , district Ballia/Balthra, Uttar Pradesh is flowing at 64.46 m against the danger level of 64.01m with Falling trend.
- River Rapti at Gorakhpur (Birdghat), district Gorakhpur, Uttar Pradesh is flowing at 74.98 m against the danger level of 74.98 m with Falling trend.

West Bengal

- River Ganga at Farakka, district Murshidabad/Farakka, West Bengal is flowing at 22.56 m against the danger level of 22.25 m with Steady trend.

- 01 team consisting of 34 personnel of 2nd Bn, NDRF deployed at Malda (West Bengal) in connection with Monsoon deployment.
- 01 team consisting of 36 personnel of 2nd Bn, NDRF deployed at Mainaguri (West Bengal) in connection with prevailing flood situation in Tista River.
- 01 team consisting of 38 personnel of 2nd Bn, NDRF deployed at Mangan (Sikkim) in connection with Monsoon deployment.
