

# WFP Uganda

## 2020 Annual Country Report Overview

Throughout 2020, WFP assisted **1.7 million people** with life-saving assistance, including **664,525 people with cash-based transfers and 284,697 with specialised nutritious foods** for the prevention of stunting, and treatment of moderate acute malnutrition for children aged 6-59 months and pregnant and lactating women.

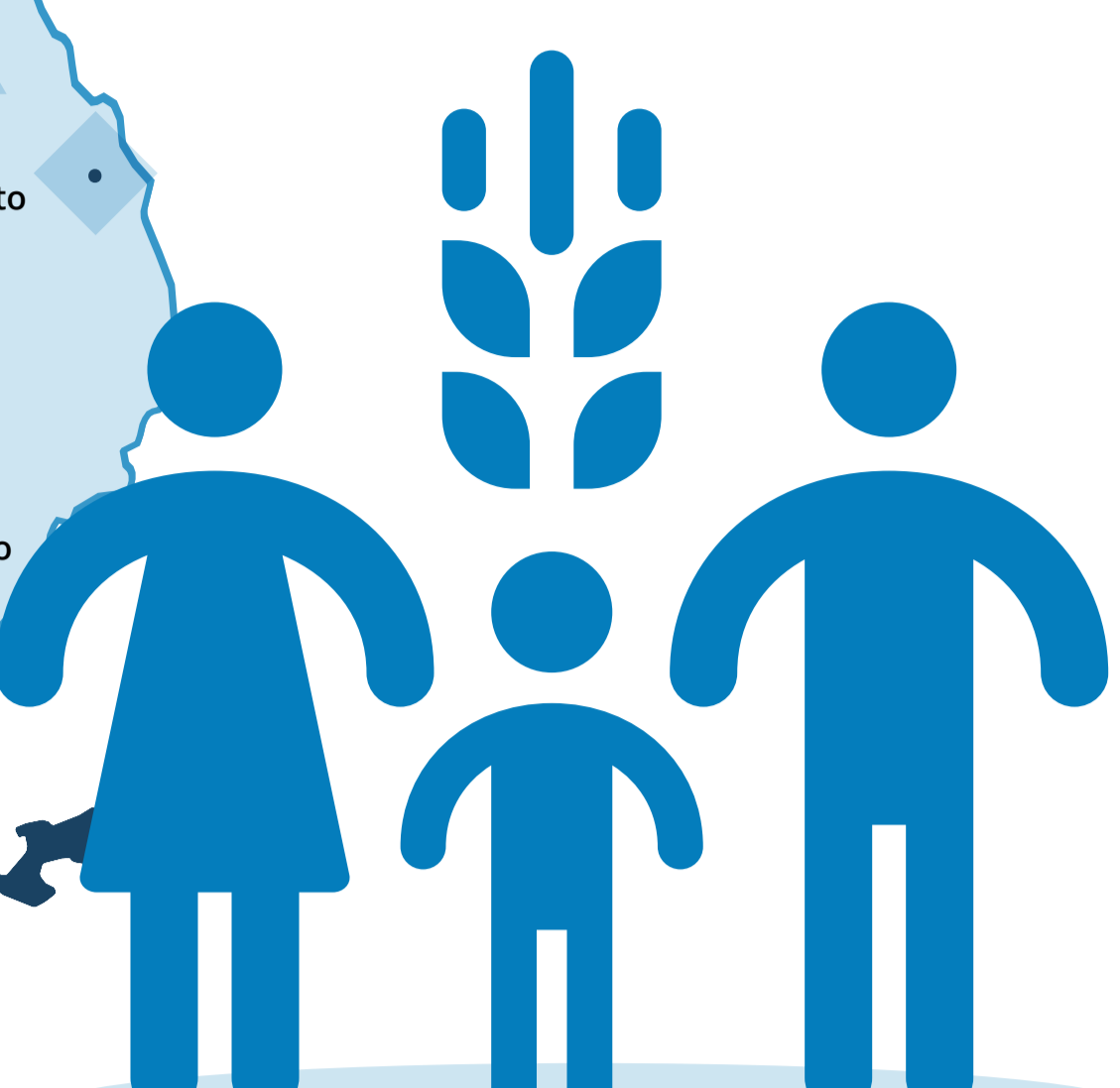
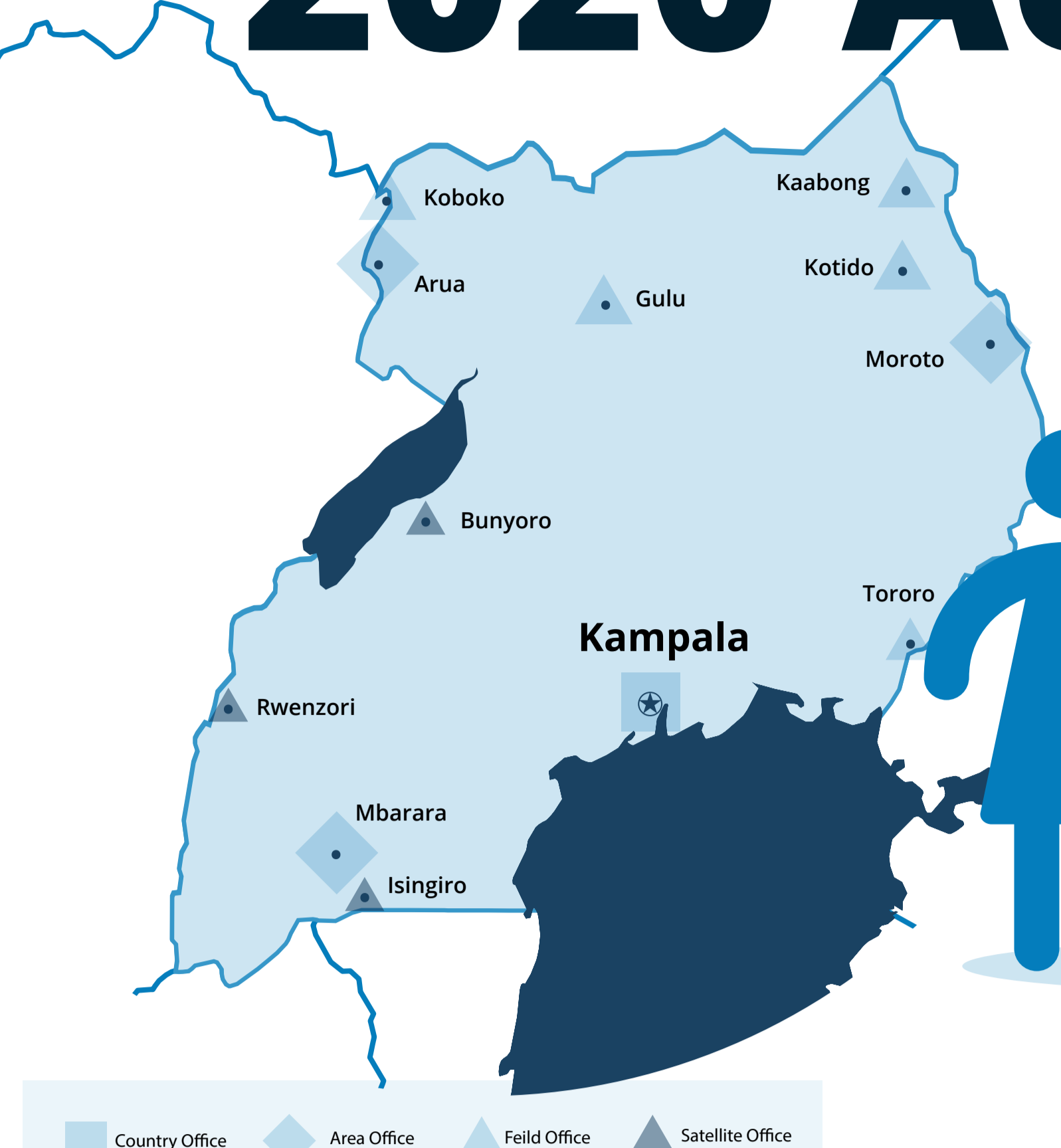

**69%** of Smallholder Farmers supported were Women

**798** Rural Producer Groups were reached with capacity strengthening initiatives

**80 mt** of maize was procured from Farmer Groups in Karamoja

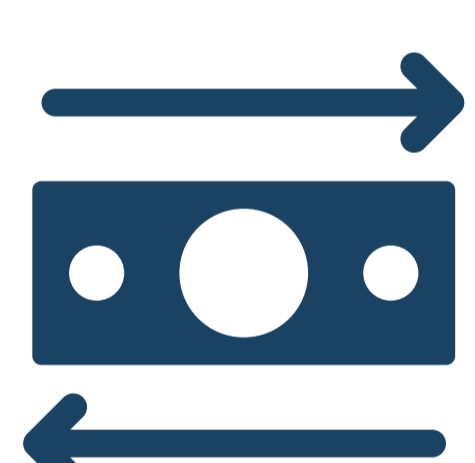
**2** Valley Dams were constructed

**1,770** Passengers were Transported on 17 flights from Uganda through Addis Ababa to other destinations of the World

WFP supported **65,995 women and men** with CBT totalling **USD 550,212** through asset creation. WFP built **16 food storage facilities**, installed **18 institutional cooking stoves** and established **355 ha of trees** for fuel wood, school orchards and gardens. These assets were designed to build community resilience against natural hazards and the impact of climate change, while strengthening rural livelihoods.

## COVID-19 Response

**52 percent** of Refugees receive Cash-Based Transfers



To sustain WFP operations in Uganda and to further limit the spread of COVID-19, WFP expanded digital solutions to include the agent banking model and mobile money to implement contactless distribution models. **WFP delivered cash-based transfers to 52 percent of refugees** – an increase from 36 percent in January 2020.

WFP Support for the Government



WFP supported Government efforts to contain the COVID-19 pandemic by installing **COVID-19 screening facilities at busy points of entry along the borders** with Tanzania, Kenya, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, South Sudan, and at Entebbe International Airport. WFP further installed screening facilities and a multi-storage unit at Namboole isolation centre.

**54,097** Urban Refugees Supported



To alleviate the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on the livelihoods of vulnerable urban refugees, and upon request from the Government of Uganda, WFP provided a **one-time cash-based transfers distribution to 54,097 Kampala-based refugees**.

**61,813** Pregnant and lactating women and girls and children



**61,813 Pregnant and lactating women and girls and children** aged 6-23 months received emergency cash assistance in West Nile

## Supply Chain



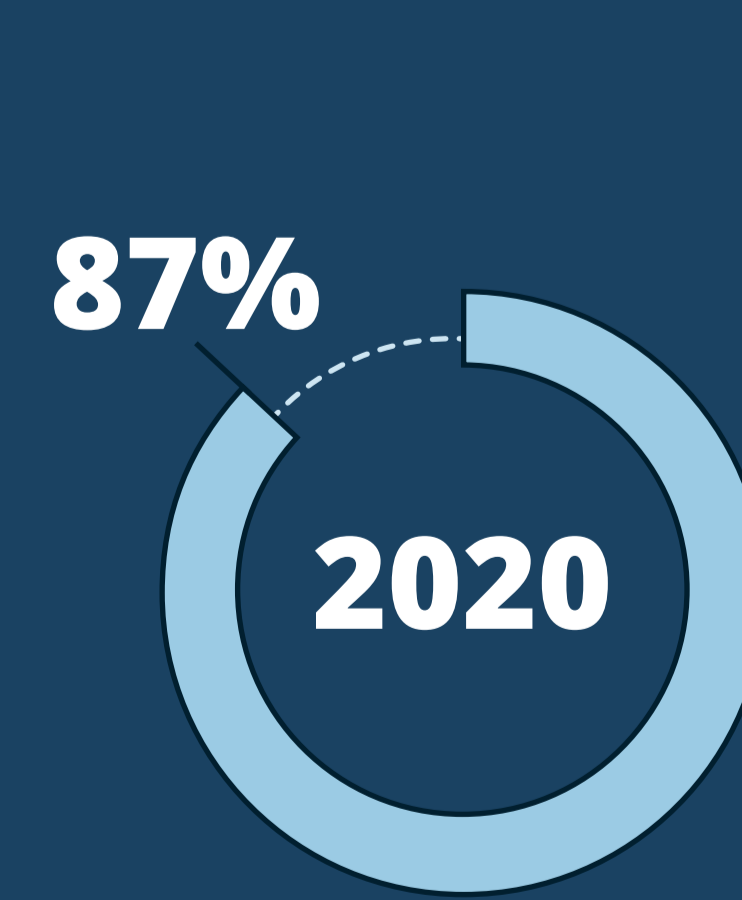
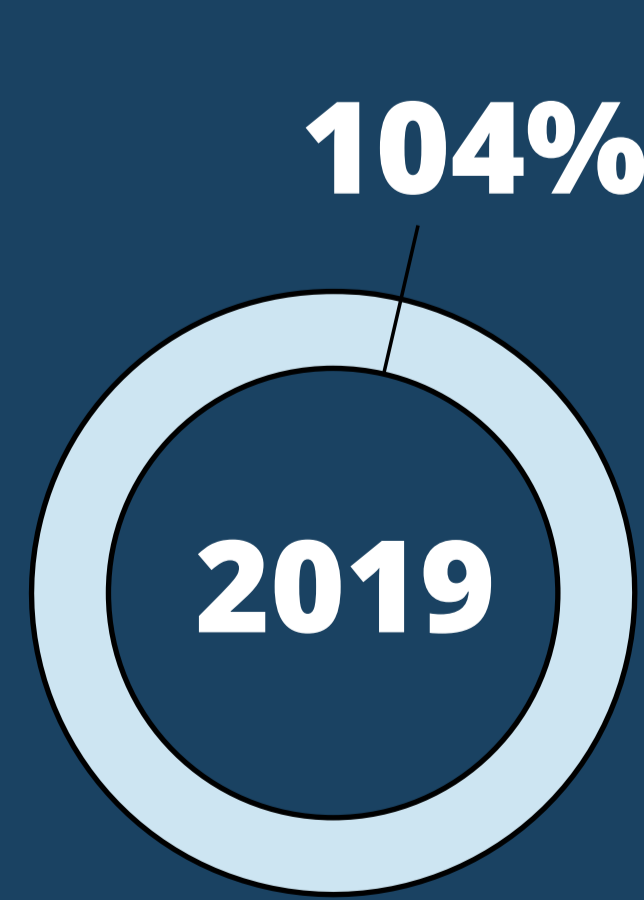
**8 Fully Serviced Fleet Trucks** were provided to the Ministry of Agriculture, Animal Industry and Fisheries for the transportation of pesticides and equipment from the Ministry's headquarters and Nairobi to Soroti during the invasion of desert locusts.



**1 Logistics Officer** was seconded to the Ministry of Health to guide the activities of the Logistics Secretariat during the COVID-19 response by reviewing proposals, overseeing technical and operational support and coordinating the logistics response alongside partners and stakeholders.

## RESOURCES

WFP was **87 percent** resourced against the annual needs-based plan in **2020**. This is considerably lower compared to **104 percent** in **2019**.
