

# YEMEN

## OVERVIEW OF NEEDS AND RESPONSE (JULY 2017) (Page 1 of 2)



The humanitarian situation in Yemen continues to deteriorate. Driven by food insecurity and a cholera outbreak caused directly by the conflict, the number of people in need of humanitarian assistance has increased by two million and now stands at 20.7. Some 9.8 million people are in acute need of assistance to save or sustain their lives while 10.8 million people need assistance to prevent them from slipping into acute need. Despite low funding levels, 124 humanitarian organizations have reached 36 per cent of the 2017 humanitarian target working in a coordinated manner across Yemen's 22 governorates. With particular emphasis on priority districts where the needs are the greatest, programming and funding must be increased in light of the rising needs.





### People in need and people in acute need by governorate







## People reached by cluster (Jan-Apr 2017) (in millions)



## Number of organizations by governorate (as of May 2017)




## Number of organizations per hub
