

- The Agriculture sector started delivering seeds from mid-April for the meher season planting, which took place from June to August. As of mid-September, about 96 percent of crop seeds had been delivered against the plans.
- School feeding has so far been reaching 70 per cent of the children targeted across the country for 2016. Other Education sector activities, such as distribution of learning kits, emergency WaSH support to schools, and the establishment of temporary learning spaces have suffered from lack of funding. The new school year was due to start in September.
- As of August 2016, 718,154 persons (130,573 households) are reportedly displaced in Ethiopia. Since the beginning of 2016, 29,301 households have been reached with emergency shelter kits and 32,227 households with NFI kits across 6 regions.
- In August / September, the food sector continued dispatching and distributing food under round five, round six and round seven, out of nine rounds planned in 2016. As of the date of publication, there are concerns about potential pipeline breaks in the last guarter of 2016.
- At least 420 health workers received orientation on AWD response; 10,000 pieces of soap were procured and distributed to communities affected by scabies in Amhara, 7,808 IECs on scabies were distributed in Amhara. 3 health centres and 9 health posts received support for strengthening RH services.
- Throughout the month of August, the Logistics Cluster continued to support NDRMC and humanitarian partners (CRS/JEOP) to augment their storage capacity, both at NDRMC regional hubs and at field levels, through the implementation of Mobile Storage Units (MSUs). At the end of August, 60 MSUs had been erected, and 4 warehouses had been rented to NDRMC in Adama, providing 40,000 MT of additional storage and reaching 66% of the target. Since July, the Logistics Cluster increased the storage capacity by 30%. This month, the Implementation of Mobile Storage Units (MSUs) around the country is experiencing delays due to heavy rains and the reluctance of transporters to operate in Amhara and Oromia regions due to insecurity.
- Overall, severe acute malnutrition admissions continued to decrease in July and the proportion admitted to the Stabilization Centre increased slightly. 195,351 persons have been admitted with SAM in Jan-Jul 2016, out of whom 15,645 admitted to inpatient care (8% of total SAM admissions). In July, 89% of the 559,756 targeted beneficiaries for MAM treatment received specialized food. However, in August only 33 % of MAM cases have been reached due to delay in delivery.
- During August the number of children reached with psychosocial support increased to 20,831 (11,656 boys, 9,175 girls) and the number of unaccompanied or separated children reunified has risen to 1,806 (999 boys and 807 girls). The training target for child protection is now 94% achieved, with a total of 4,679 (2,879 male and 1,800 female) government and NGO staff and community volunteers having received training in child protection in emergencies. In Amhara region, hundreds of children and women are reported to be migrating to Bahir Dar from other districts (particularly Waghimra, North and South Wollo) due to the drought, and the Bureau of Women's and Children's Affairs conducted an assessment this month of 228 migrants (including 106 children) to identify their needs.
- As of end of August, the WaSH Cluster had reached 86% of the targeted 9,616,260 people. For the provision of safe water, 69.6% of the target population was reached, including through construction and rehabilitation of safe water sources, water trucking as well as provision of water containers and water treatment chemicals. Hygiene promotion services reached 16.4% of the target population. Hygiene and sanitation promotion efforts need to be stepped up for all emergency WaSH interventions, as these are key in preventing the spread of WaSH related diseases. Most of the Emergency WaSH interventions (90%) have benefitted communities, while 10% have gone to institutions (schools and health centres).

In order to support management of the humanitarian response in Ethiopia, sectors have identified a set of response and contextual indicators. The monthly data provided against those indicators by the sectors has been visualized in the following info graphics. These visuals will help understand how the drought response is progressing and identify where issues are developing so that proactive measures can be taken







Agriculture (as of 09 September 2016)

Seed delivered from April to 09 September for *meher* season (against planned)








b) % of veg seed (KG) delivered per region against planned






2 Livestock interventions (as of 09 September)

The value of livestock interventions - mainly consisting in distribution of survival and supplementary livestock feed, support to fodder production through the provision of forage seed and animal treatments/vaccinations - is estimated at about 12 Million USD. Data collection is currently ongoing.









Emergency Shelter and NFI









STOCK & PIPELINE

The cluster currently has 17,740 emergency shelter and household NFI kits in country, with additional 22,500 kits being procured, and a further 3,750 kits pending final funding agreement. Based on existing capacity and the expected increase in the need to respond to *meher* floods, coupled with known supplies currently under procurement, the cluster is expected to reach 53% of those targeted in the 2016 HRD.




Dispatch status by region




Distribution status by region




Food tonnage allocated by region by region












Number of Health Care Workers trained (January - August 2016)









Ethiopia: Cluster response and contextual indicators (August 2016)


















SAM admissions, 2015-2016 by region











Cumulative % of vulnerable women and girls including men and boys accessed psychosocial support services in Women Friendly Spaces per month




Cumulative % of unaccompanied and separated children reunified with their families per month





Cumulative % of vulnerable women and adolescent girls in priority one hot spot woredas received dignity kits per month









Percentage of sample population having access to potable water


2 Water access coverage per region

Percentage of water access coverage per region




3 Functionality of water schemes per region

Percentage of functionality of water schemes per region




Progress against Humanitarian Requirements Document (HRD)


