TOP 5 AREAS OF NGOS' INTERVENTIONS









HEALTH PROMOTION

Raise awareness. train health workers, provide medical supplies and hygiene items.



CASE MANAGEMENT

Provide medical care for Ebola patients and ensure infection control.



COMMUNICATION/ SOCIAL **MOBILIZATION**

Engage with communities to raise awareness and inform.



CONTACT TRACING

Identify, trace and monitor people who have had high-risk exposure to Ebola.



COORDINATION

Support national and local capacities and country health teams.
