

DISPLACEMENT IN MARIB

5 MARCH 2020

SITUATION OVERVIEW

Conflict activities continue to escalate in Marib and Al Jawf governorates, with a significant increase since 01 March leading to high displacements into Marib city and surrounding areas. IOM estimates that over 1,000 households (HH) have been displaced from Al Jawf and Raghwan district in Marib since 01 March alone. A majority of the displaced are moving towards Marib city, Marib Al Wadi, Madghal and Sirwah districts in Marib.


Displacement numbers are likely to be higher, as movements remain fluid. IDP tracking and registration activities are being expanded to capture displacement trends, and contingency planning to meet projected needs is ongoing. IDPs are in need of safe shelters, essential aid items, emergency health care, clean water and safe sanitation and food. Since the increase in hostilities on 21 January, 16,905 Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) have received these critical supplies with support from IOM and partners.

RESPONSE

IOM has been operating in Marib since 2019 and has a team of 14 international and nearly 50 national support and programme staff. As the lead of the CCCM and S-NFI sub-national clusters, and co-lead of the WASH sub-national cluster, IOM is scaling up humanitarian assistance with partners across Marib while supporting the response in Al Jawf.

CAMP COORDINATION & CAMP MANAGEMENT (CCCM)

- **Mobile Operations Centre** effective in Marib City to coordinate response activities, and in response to the heightened displacement from Al Jawf, an IDP registration centre has been set up in Marib city to receive new arrivals.
- **Expansion of Al Mil camp ongoing;** IOM has demarcated 80 plots to host new IDPs.

SHELTER & NON-FOOD ITEMS (S-NFI) AND RAPID RESPONSE MECHANISM (RRM)

- **2,415 RRM kits distributed** to newly displaced households across Marib governorate.
- **1,367 multi-purpose cash** have been transferred.
- **Beneficiary targeting, in coordination with partners,** is ongoing ahead of the distribution of 4,000 emergency shelter kits (ESKs) and 3,500 non-food items (NFI) in Marib. Priority will be given to IDPs displaced since 01 March.
- **50 tents have been installed in Al Mil.** A total of 887 tents will be set up by IOM and partners in the site.

HEALTH

- **899 newly displaced people** in Al Jufainah camp received health assistance through IOM's mobile clinics.
- **In coordination with the Governorate Health Office,** two additional mobile clinics will cover more than 20 IDP sites in Marib City and Al Wadi districts in March.

WATER, SANITATION & HYGIENE (WASH)

- **Average of 13,000 litres of safe drinking water** trucked per day in three IDP sites. IOM has distributed a total of 395,400 litres of safe drinking water since 27 January.
- **215 family tanks (500L each)** have been distributed. IOM is providing non-chlorinated water on a weekly basis for these tanks; 132,000 liters delivered since 19 February.
- **Seven water tanks installed in Al Sowayda,** Al Khuseef and Al Ma'asher displacement sites.
- **IOM is installing over 300 family latrines** in Marib Al Wadi and Sirwah districts.
- **In response to the most recent displacement,** IOM is building 35 emergency latrines in Al Mil camp, serving 140 new IDP households. Additional emergency latrines will be constructed as needed.
- **IOM has distributed a total of 561 hygiene kits and 140 jerrycans** in 3 sites. 500 additional hygiene kits are being distributed to new IDPs.

CLUSTER RESPONSE

Activities are being coordinated through the CCCM, SNFI, WASH, Health, RRM and Logistics Clusters, at the national and sub-national level.

- The RRM cluster (UNFPA) is transporting 1,000 RRM kits to Marib for IOM distribution.
- A second mobile storage unit has been installed in Jufainah camp in Marib city.
- The sub-national S-NFI and CCCM clusters in Marib (IOM) are actively coordinating the emergency response on the ground in close partnership with the Executive Unit
