

Ethiopia: Dashboard - Sector Response and Contextual Indicators (October 2016)

The Agriculture sector started delivering seeds from mid-April for the *meher* season planting, which took place from June to September. As of end of September, about 98 percent of crop seeds had been delivered against the plans.



The 2016 HRD Mid-Year Review targeted 4.08 million school children for school feeding and learning supplies as well as 2,538 schools for school WaSH and 395 for Temporarily Learning Centers in emergency affected *woredas*. School WaSH in 200 schools is currently under implementation by the UNICEF WaSH Section. As of October, learning supplies had been distributed to approx. 1.8m school children. There was no response from July to September, which was the school break in the Ethiopian education system.



As of August 2016, 718,154 persons (130,573 households) were reported as displaced in Ethiopia. By the end of September, the cluster had reached more than 250,900 people (45,600 households) with emergency shelter material and household non-food items such as kitchen sets and beddings.



In October, the food sector continued dispatching and distributing food under rounds seven and eight, out of nine rounds planned in 2016.



In October, more than 2,000 health care workers in the country received training in various areas of health including AWD. In Addis Ababa, Harari and SNNP regions, over 85% of children targeted for measles immunization were reached.



As identified in the Logistics Gaps Analysis (April 2016), the large amount of incoming humanitarian cargo has placed a strain on the existing storage capacity, and subsequently a need for additional warehouses and temporary storage facilities. In this regard, over 50,000 MT in additional storage capacity have been provided by the Logistics Cluster in more than 80 locations, for NDRMC and JEOP use. The Logistics Cluster has finalised the first local construction of one permanent warehouse in Elwane, Somali region, providing 350 MT additional storage capacity. These achievements provide an additional storage capacity of 50,000 MT, 80 percent of the 60,000 MT target. An additional 10,000 MT storage capacity is being implemented in Somali, Oromia, Tigray and SNNP regions. The Logistics Cluster has also facilitated the availability of financial human resources on behalf of the NDRMC to secure a temporary surge in qualified staff. Throughout the month of October, a total of 980 additional staff including storekeepers and data entry clerks have been recruited out of a total of 1,002 positions identified. In addition to that, Food Aid Warehouse Management trainings for 35 new recruits have been rolled out in October in Dire Dawa.



Overall, SAM admissions have increased in September (admissions 26,151 and 89.1% reporting rate) compared to July (admissions 22,979 and 87.1% reporting rate) and August (admissions 24,482 and 87.4% reporting rate). 247,480 children have been admitted with SAM in January - September, out of whom 19,920 admitted to inpatient care (8.2% of total SAM admissions). In October, 100% of MAM beneficiaries admitted received Specialized Nutritious Foods (SNFs) in TSF priority 1 *woredas* in Amhara region.



During October the number of children identified as having experienced or being at risk of violence, abuse, exploitation or neglect reached a total of 1,483 (877 boys, 606 girls). Oromia is one of the regions with the highest number of identification of such cases (571 children: 249 girls, 322 boys). The number of unaccompanied or separated children (UASC) continued to be identified by BoWCAs and BoLSA during the month (437 children: 195 girls, 242 boys), with a cumulative total of 6,597 (3,901 boys, 2,696 girls) UASC identified since the beginning of the response. Separation of children from families is most often caused by parents migrating (leaving children behind) or children migrating, in search of livelihoods or pasture/water. The number of children supported to return to families has now reached 2,671 (1,184 boys, 1,487 girls).



WaSH partners managed to reach 10 million people gaining lifesaving WaSH services with 83% of them in "drought affected" areas, which exceeds the target population of 9.6 million people. Approximately 10% of the WaSH cluster response is towards AWD response and 6% towards Floods response focusing on WaSH NFI and hygiene promotion. Analysis of these services reveals that aside from water trucking and household water treatment, the rehabilitation of motorized boreholes was the most common intervention. This was due to the fact that motorized schemes were located in shallow or deep wells that had sufficient groundwater storage to withstand the shock of the *El Niño*. By far, the largest response in 2016 was from the Government and UNICEF, which accounted for both 70% of the results and 80% of the finance. NGOs contributed significantly with 26 NGOs contributing to the cluster response.

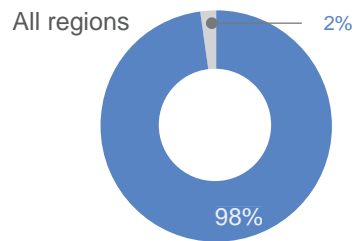

b) % of veg seed (KG) delivered per region against planned



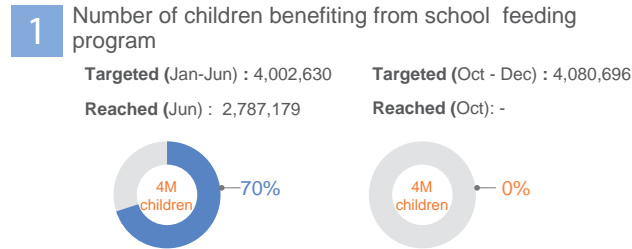
2 Livestock interventions (as of 09 September)

The value of livestock interventions - mainly consisting in distribution of survival and supplementary livestock feed, support to fodder production through the provision of forage seed and animal treatments/vaccinations - is estimated at about 12 Million USD. Data collection is currently ongoing.

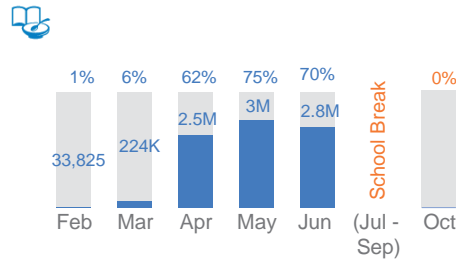
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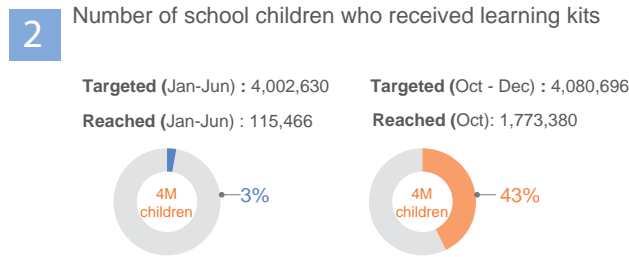
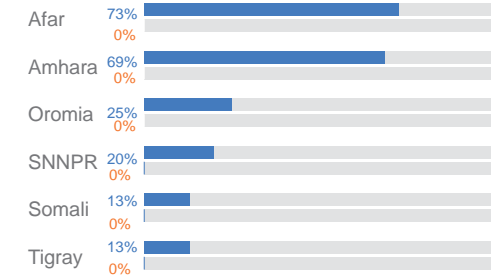

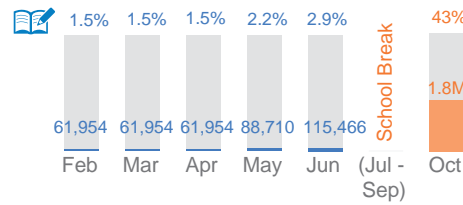
Percentage of children benefiting from school feeding program against the target per month



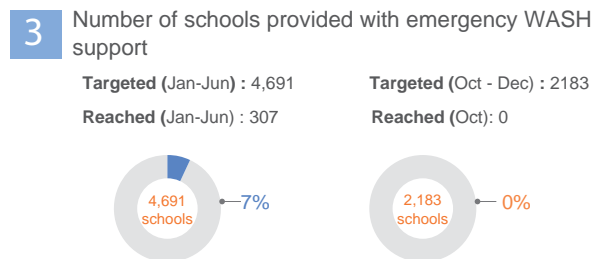
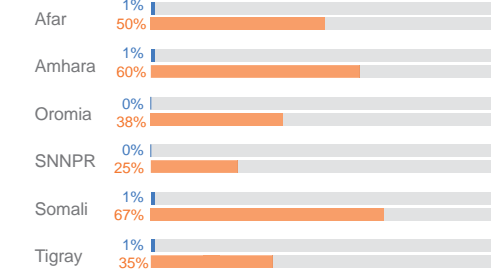
Percentage of children benefiting from school feeding program per region against the targets



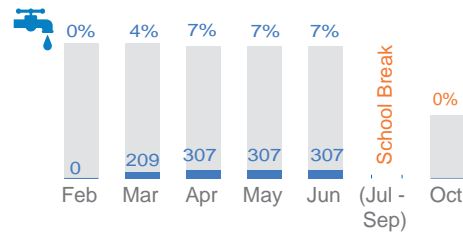
Cumulative % of school children who received learning kits per month



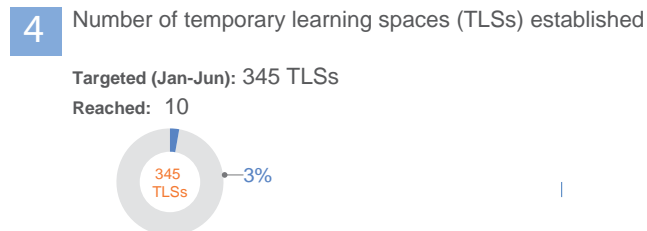
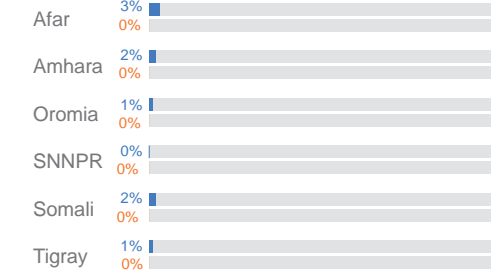
Cumulative % of school children received learning kits per region



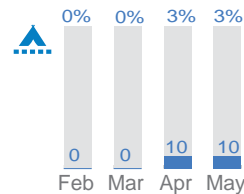
Cumulative % of schools provided with emergency WASH support per month

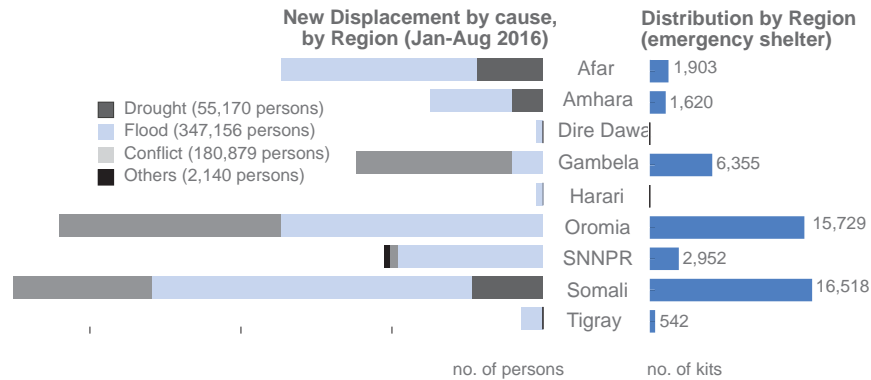
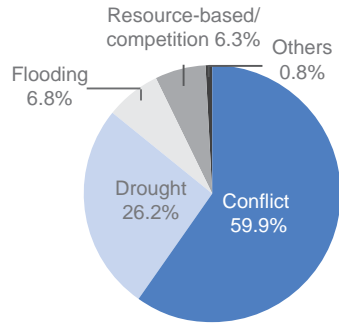

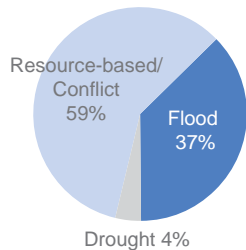
STOCK & PIPELINE

The cluster has close to 21,000 emergency shelter and household NFI kits in country, with additional 26,000 kits being procured. Based on existing capacity and the expected increase in need to response to on-going displacements, coupled with known supplies currently under procurement, the cluster is expected to reach 62% of those targeted in the 2016 HRD.

DISTRIBUTION

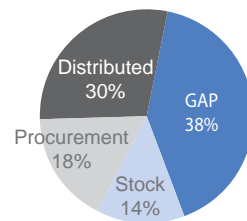
By the end of September, the cluster has reached more than 250,900 people (45,600 households) with emergency shelter material and household non-food items such as kitchen sets and beddings. Of those assisted, 37% percent were displaced by flood, 4% by drought and 59% by conflict.

Distribution by cause of displacement

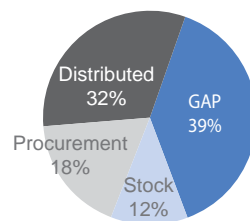

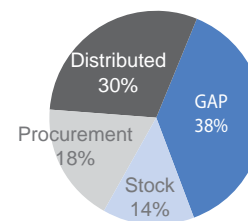

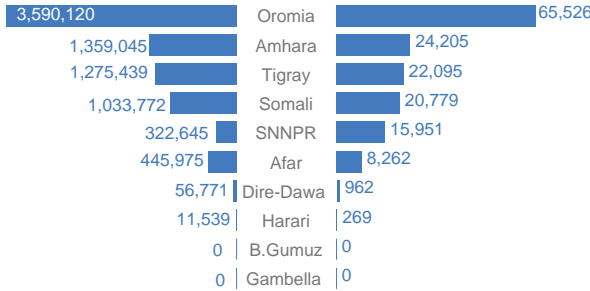

Number of beneficiaries allocated with food ration by region

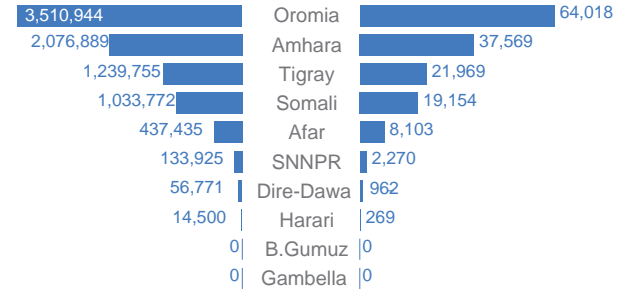


Food tonnage allocated by region

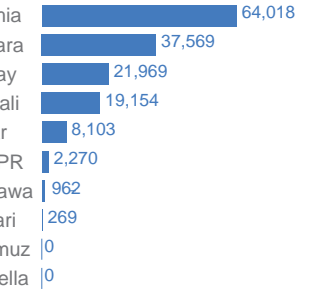

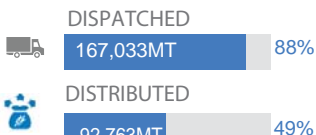

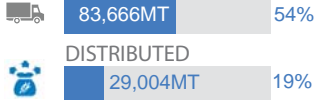


2 Percentage of food tonnage dispatched and distributed by round (against allocation)

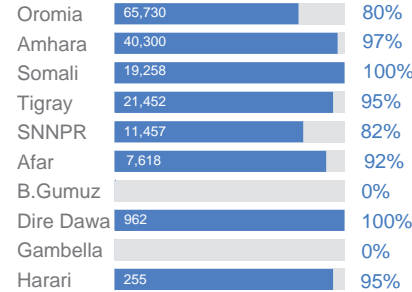

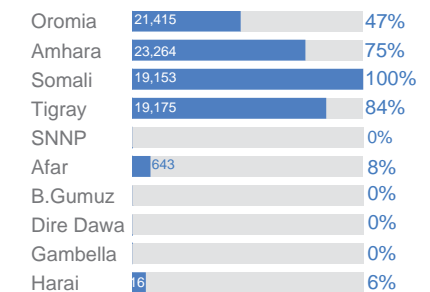

Dispatch status by region

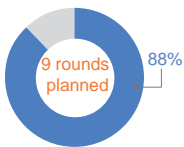

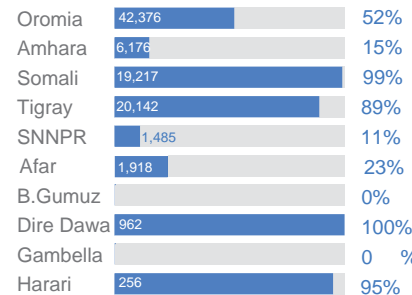

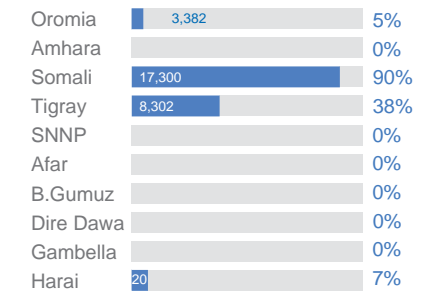
Food pipeline breakdown by month in MT



Distribution status by region



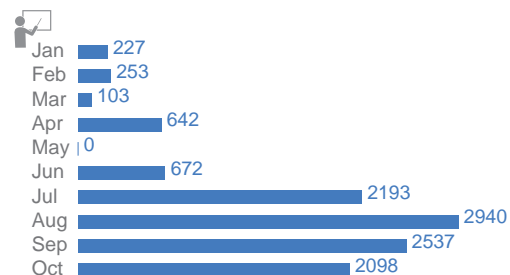

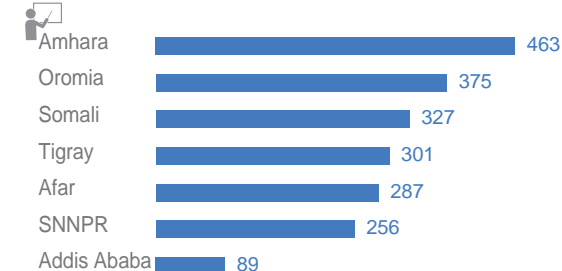

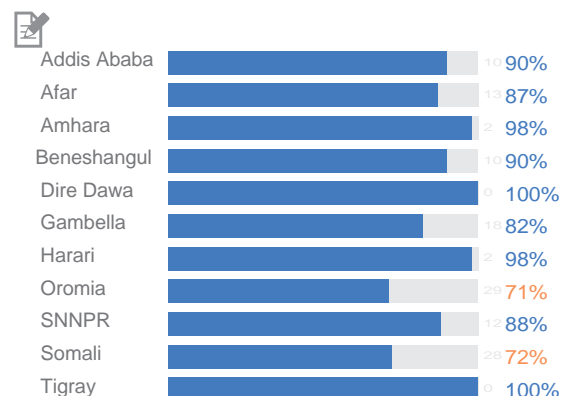

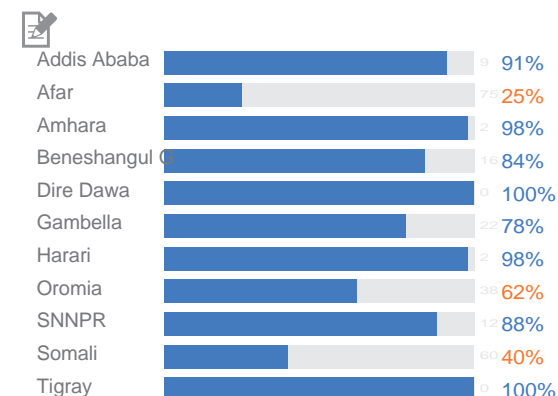

Completeness of epidemiological reports by region



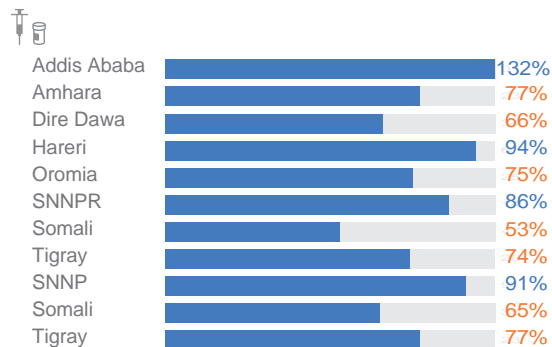
Timeliness of epidemiological reports by region

Percentage of children reached with measles immunization by region

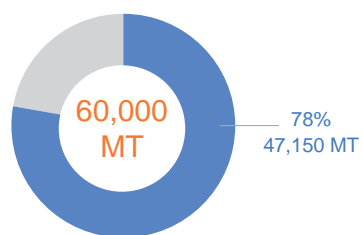


LOGISTICS

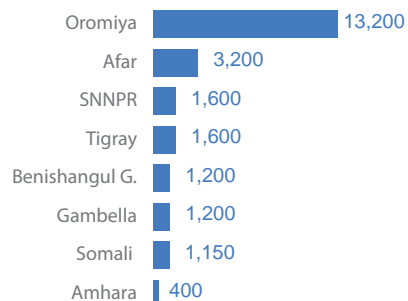

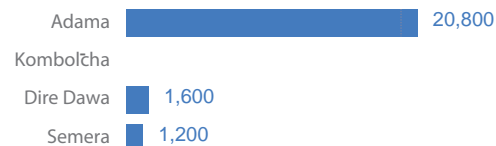

Field Storage (MT)



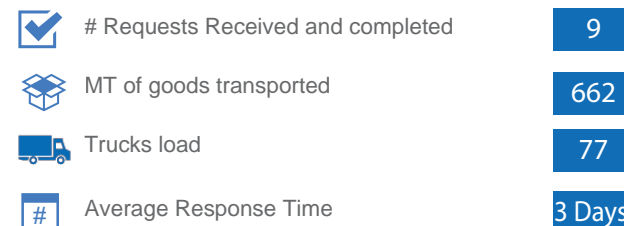

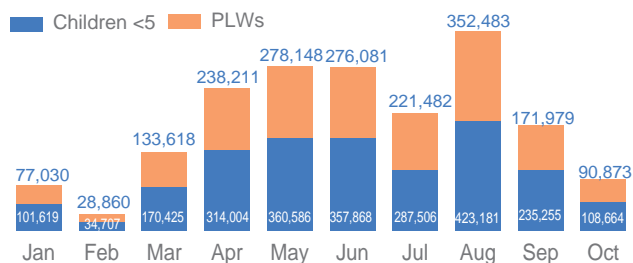

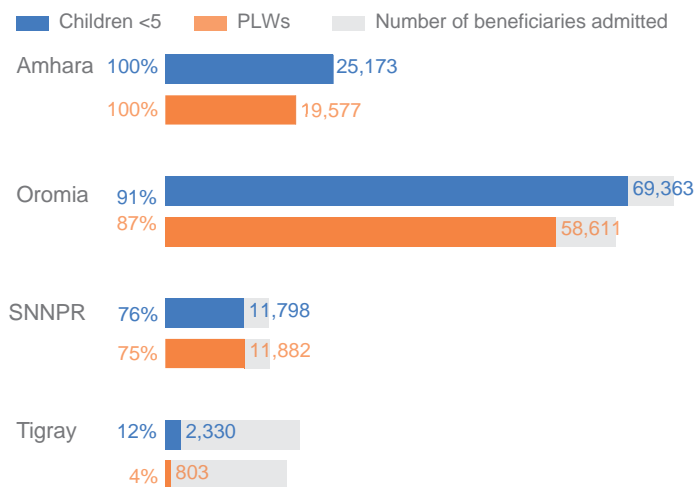
Beneficiaries reached from January to October 2016

Number of beneficiaries reached (received SNFs) in October by region



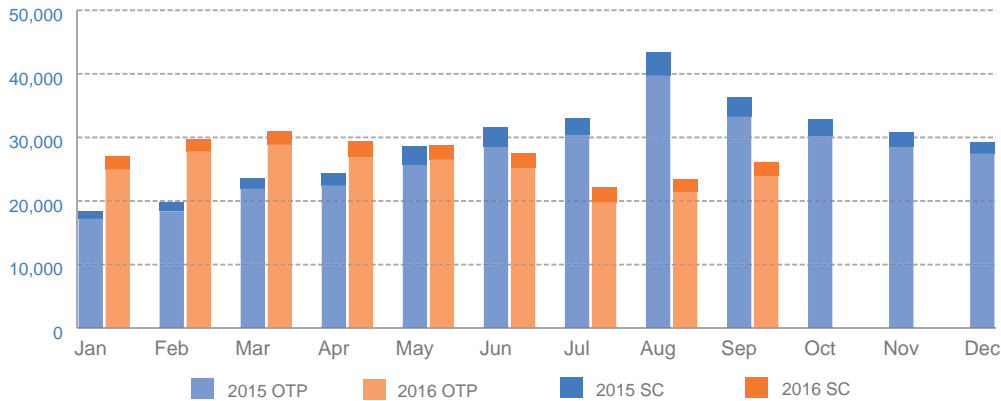

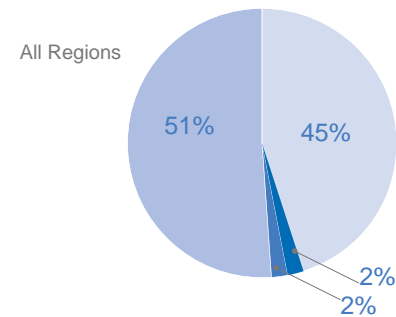

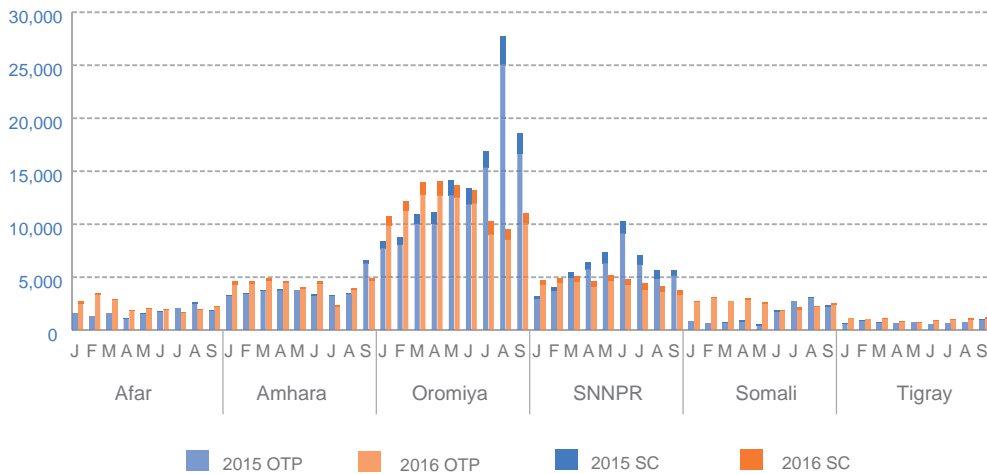
SAM admissions, 2015-2016, all regions (September 2016)



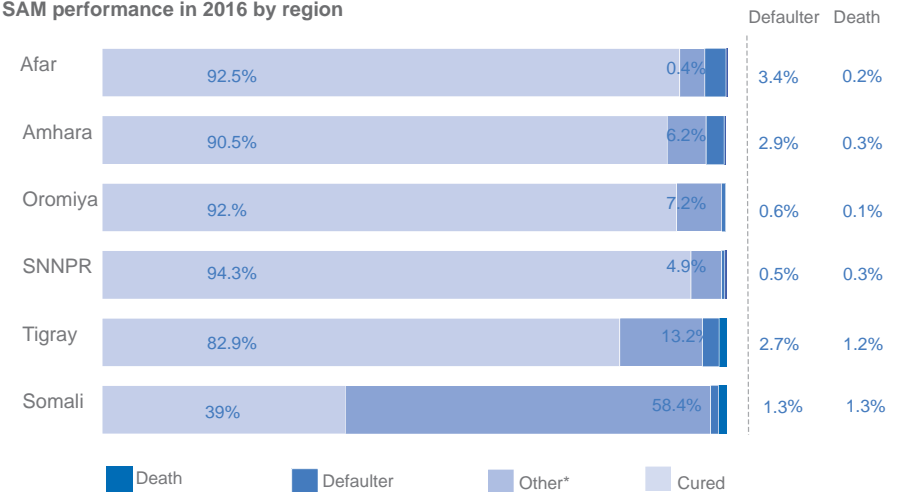
SAM performance in 2016, all regions

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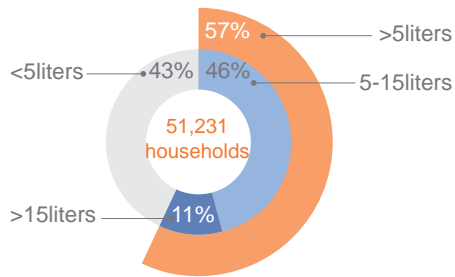

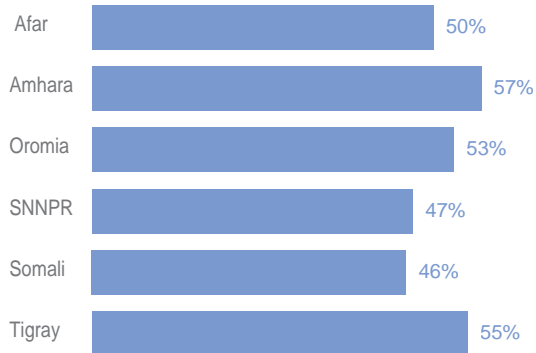

Target: 90% of population having access to >5litres per person per day in a sample population



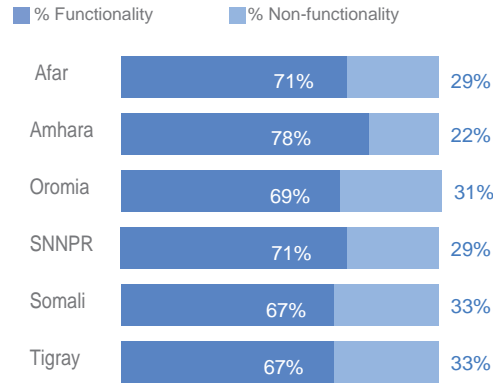
2 Water access coverage per region

Percentage of water access coverage per region



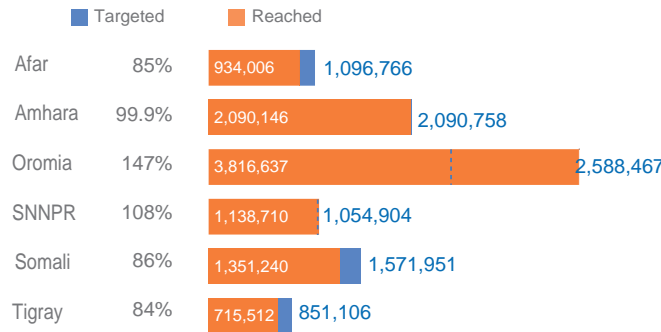
3 Functionality of water schemes per region

Percentage of functionality of water schemes per region



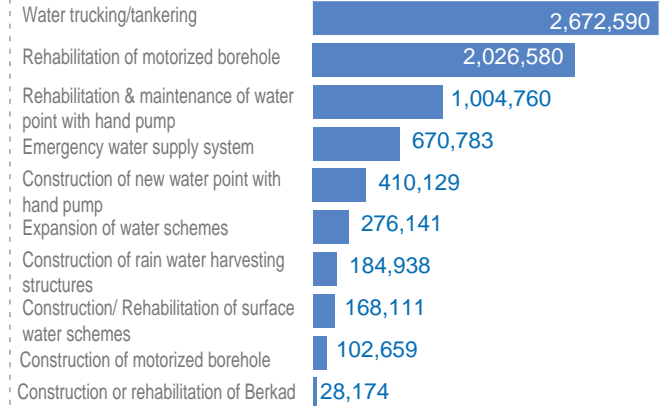

Percentage of beneficiaries reached vs HRD target*

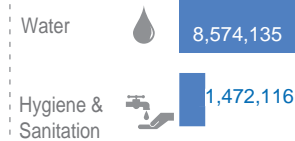

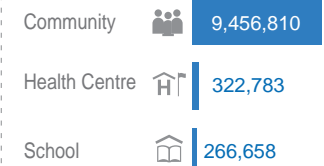
Water supply beneficiaries



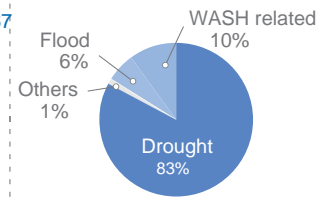
Beneficiaries per domain



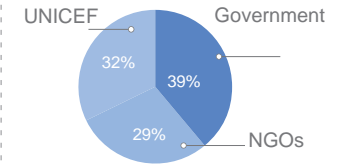
Activity location
