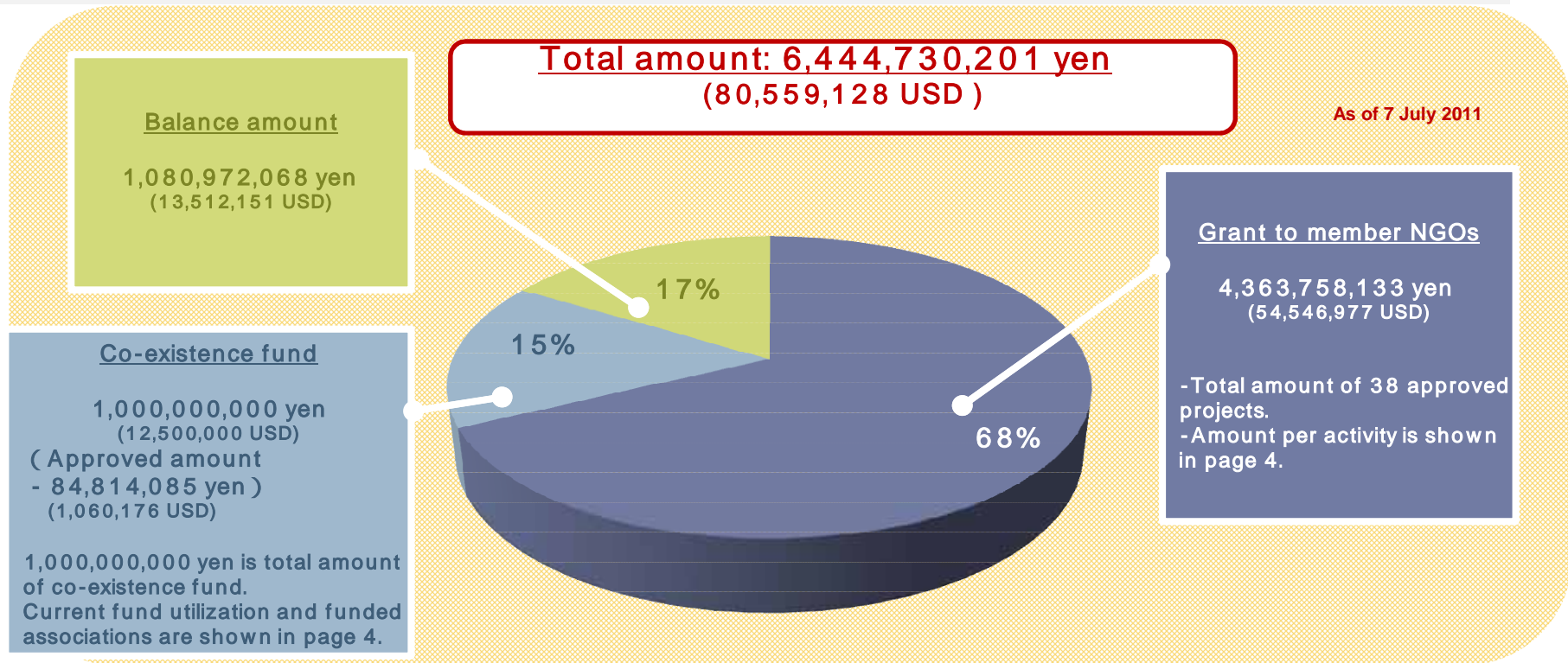

Concrete outcome of coordination effort in Miyagi

As of 11 July 2011

Japan Platform becomes a key actor of four-party meeting (Govt. Disaster Response HQ, Pref. Disaster Response HQ, Self Defense Force and Pref. Disaster Volunteer Centre -Pref. Social Welfare Councils/NGOs/NPOs) and tripartite meeting at municipality level. As a result, JPF has been undertaking various coordination activities such as public-private cooperative activities, coordination of matching beneficiary needs with donor supplies and service providers, coordination of sectoral support and local level activities ,

Wet feeding

Self Defense Force, Volunteer center and NPOs conduct wet feeding at the same areas; therefore, it is very important to share information on each actor's feeding schedule and avoid overlapping of wet feeding at the same evacuation centers/zones.

In Ishinomaki, the tripartite meeting takes place periodically and local administration, SDF and NPOs cover approx. 30,000 meals in an effective and coordinated manner.

In Kesennuma, a clear distinction between the role of SDI and NPO was discussed and it was decided that SDI provides staple food such as rice and miso soup while NPOs mainly provide the subsidiaries. Regarding needs for wet feeding to affected people at home, information sharing has been conducted in the tripartite meeting and proper actions have been taken.



JAFS's activity

Temporary housing

Coordination effort was made between local administration and NPOs in order to provide " starter pack " for temporary housing and also each municipality chose NPO in charge for starter pack project. The NPO in charge coordinated with each municipality and corporate enterprise and carried out procurement, transportation and volunteer support.

Approx. 23,000 sets of starter pack have been provided to temporary housing of 11 municipalities within Miyagi prefecture.

Starter pack : a set of daily necessities such as pots, dishes and blankets.



PWJ's activity

Volunteer acceptance during " Golden Week "

Lack of capacity of volunteer centers during Golden Week was discussed in the four-party meeting. In order to strengthen capacity of volunteer centers to deal with many volunteers who were willing to support affected people during the vacation week, local administration, NPOs and corporate enterprise agreed to deploy backup staffing to Social welfare Councils in the municipalities JPF deployed backup staffing to Kesennuma, Ongawa, Ishinomaki and Higashimatsushima in order to set up the volunteer bus acceptance system.



NICCO's activity

Government support system for affected people

NPOs introduced Government support system for life and business reconstruction to affected people. Questions and needs gathered by NPOs through hearings from affected people were discussed with Govt. and local administration. By answering the questions and improving the system, NPOs are encouraging the affected people to use the support system.

Ishinomaki disaster recovery assistance council run by NGO/NPO sums up the links of the Government support system and posts it on the HP.

With reference to the support system on fishery reconstruction, NPOs asked the questions to the administration directly and clarified with them.

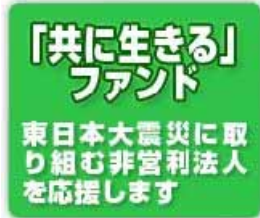

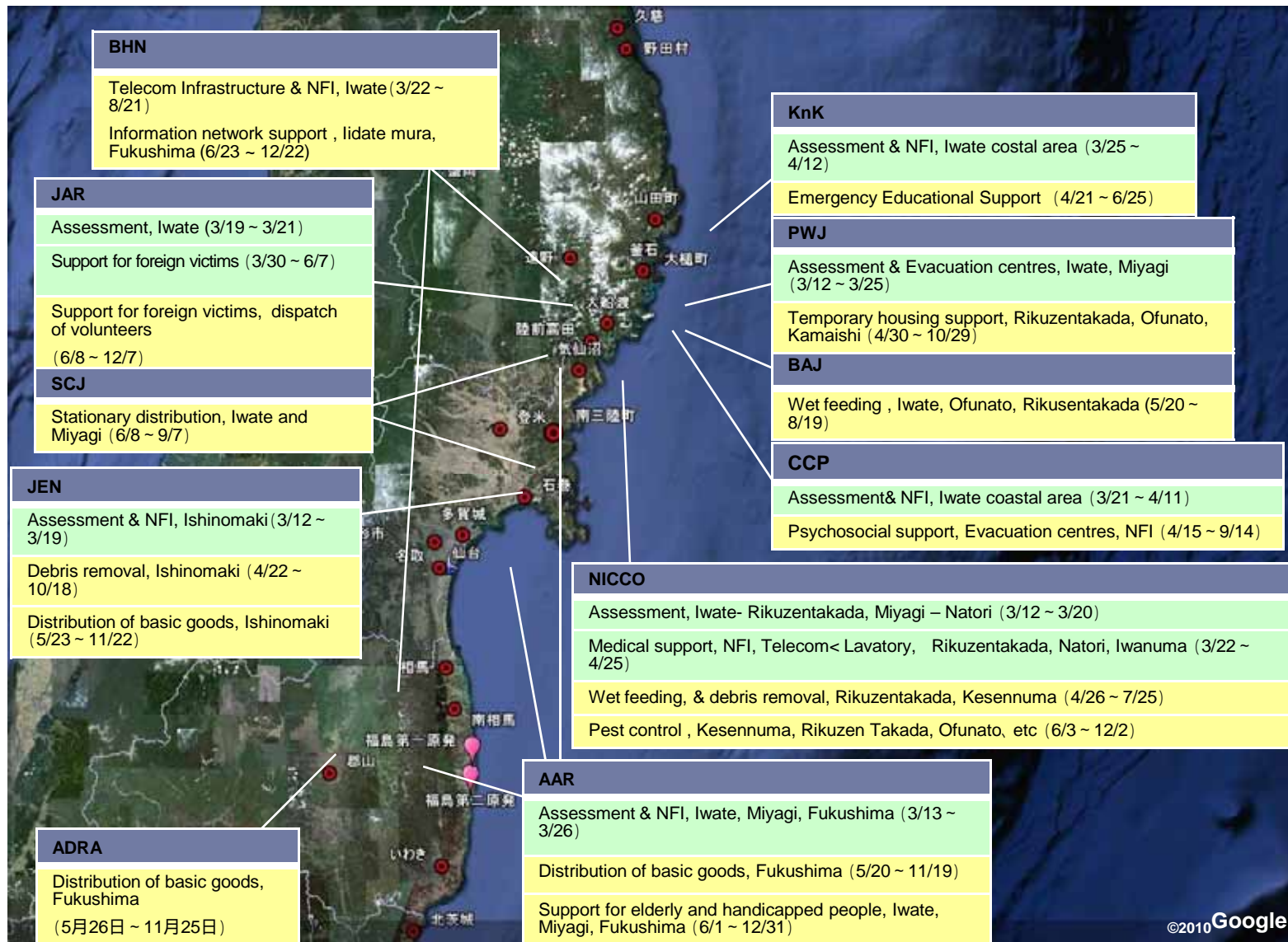
