

# Mali : humanitarian snapshot - flood and population movements (June - July 2016)

Floods from 12-27 July have caused 13 casualties, affected 9,585 people, destroyed 1,459 houses and caused significant material damage in affected areas, according to the National Directorate of Civilian Protection. National Authorities with the support of humanitarian organizations delivered emergency aid to thousands of affected people, in terms of shelter, food, non-food items, water purification and hygiene products, etc.

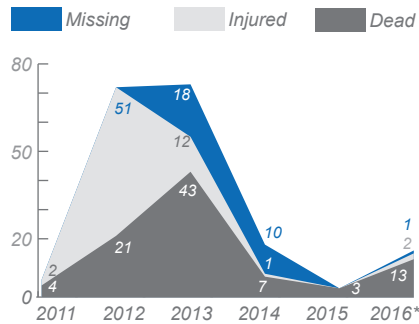

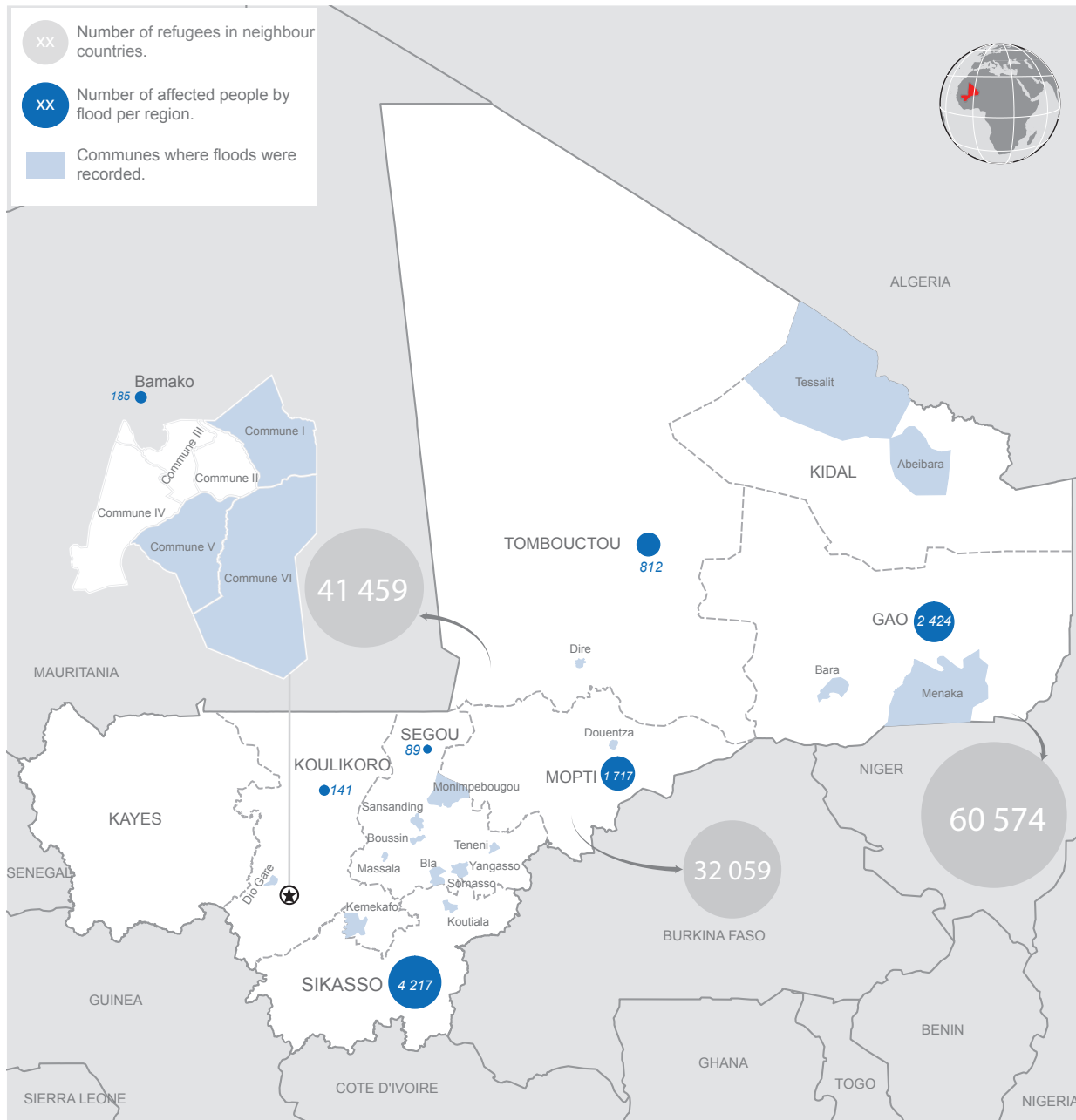
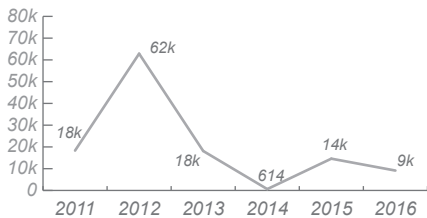

IDP (Internally displaced people) as of 03 August 2016.



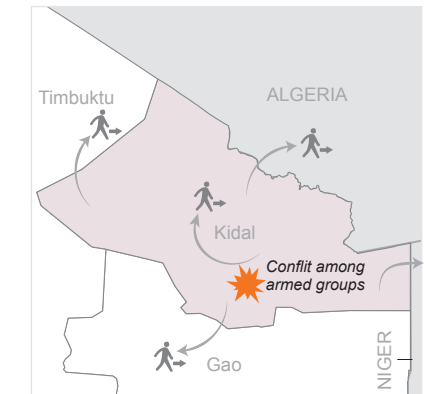
*The number of internally displaced persons (IDPs) has not changed since May 2016. However, it has been reduced by 50% since July 2015.*
