

PAKISTAN - Sindh Flood 2011 - Union Council Ranking - Naushahro Feroze District



Union council ranking exercise, coordinated by UNOCHA and UNDP, is a joint effort of Government and humanitarian partners in the notified districts of 2011 floods in Sindh. Its purpose is to: Identify high priority union councils with outstanding needs. Facilitate stakeholders to plan/support interventions and divert resources where they are most needed. Provide common prioritization framework to clusters, agencies and donors. First round of this exercise is completed from February - March 2012.
