

SOUTH SUDAN

South Sudan continues to face considerable humanitarian challenges. Poor harvests, soaring food and fuel prices, conflict and displacement led to rising hunger and malnutrition across the country.



YEMEN

Despite positive political developments, the humanitarian situation has worsened. Severe food insecurity has doubled and malnutrition is above emergency thresholds in several parts of Yemen.




5.1 million
