1. Philippines - Flood waters are beginning to recede in flood affected areas on Mindanao. Nevertheless nearly 560,000 people remain affected, of whom only 9,000 are in evacuation centres. Source: OCHA

2. India - Seasonal flooding have killed more than 130 and affected more than 2.5 million people across the country. West Bengal, Bihar, Kerala are the most

affected states. Source: GLIDE

3. Indonesia - Mt Lokon has erupted 20 times since 5 July. From 10 July, the government evacuated approximately 39,000 residents living within a 3.5km radius of the volcano. Source: Media

4. Japan - A 7.1M EQ struck of the east coast of Honshu triggering a small tsunami. There were no reports of damage or casualties. Source: PDC

5. Philippines - A 6.2M EQ struck the Negros area of Reg VI triggering a tsunami warning. There were no reports of damage or casualties. Source: PDC, OCHA

6. Pacific - Tropical Depression 8 has formed far from the eastern coast of the Philippines. Source: PDC

Precipitation Forecast - The latest forecast suggests a 50% chance of greater than average precipitation in Papua New Guinea. Drier than normal conditions are expected affect Tuvalu and, to a lesser extent, Kiribati. Source: IRI
