

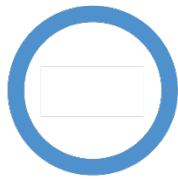


# Nigeria: Adamawa State

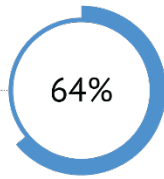

### HIGHLIGHTS

- The UN, government, and military met Madagali community members to address the food insecurity situation.

### SITUATION OVERVIEW

#### UN Humanitarian Coordinator visits Madagali LGA

The United Nations Humanitarian Coordinator for Nigeria, Mr. Edward Kallon, along with representatives from World Food Programme (WFP) and OCHA met with officials from the state government, humanitarian partners, and members of the affected population during a visit to Madagali LGA on 4 August. The visit aimed to further ascertain the food security and nutrition situation in the community and to also find out from vulnerable people living in the LGA what their needs are. The team also visited a proposed site for the establishment of a humanitarian hub in Gulak town, headquarters of the LGA, and gained an insight into some of the challenges affecting humanitarian operations and the support needed for a more tailored and timely response.

### HUMANITARIAN RESPONSE

#### Camp Coordination and Camp Management / Non-Food Items

##### Response:

- IOM reached 9,356 individuals across 8 sites in 4 LGAs during 8 COVID-19 awareness sessions. An estimated 9,380 individuals across 6 sites in 4 LGAs were reached in 6 hygiene promotion campaign sessions. An estimated 3,706 individuals across 5 sites in 4 LGAs were reached with a cholera preparedness and awareness campaign.
- IOM assisted 12 households with shelter repair kits including tarpaulins and nails for shelter upgrades at Wuro Yanka.
- IOM CCCM established protection committees at Fufore and Malkohi camps, each comprising of 20 individuals selected from the camp population to strengthen the protection activities in the camps.

#### Education

##### Needs:

- Continual capacity-building support is needed for teachers, as well as refresher trainings on coaching and mentoring.
- Strengthened infrastructure is required for school buildings.

##### Response:

- Over 10,000 out-of-school children are receiving accelerated learning program (ALP) classes in Michika, Mubi North, and Maiha with the support from over 300 learning facilitators.
- IRC trained 50 teachers in Michika and 77 teachers in Madagali on catch-up classes.



## Nutrition

**Needs:**

- Screening of under-five community children is required for the identification of malnutrition.
- Nutrition counseling and sensitization on infant and young child feeding (IYCF) and good hygiene practices is needed.

**Response:**

- IRC reached 46 pregnant and lactating mothers during one-on-one counseling sessions and 195 during group counseling sessions in both Askira and Michika LGA.
- IRC trained 21 caregivers on mother's MUAC in both Michika and Askira Uba LGAs.



## Protection

**Needs:**

- Field monitoring is required to ensure that beneficiaries receive socio-economic support.

**Response:**

- IOM conducted mental health and psychosocial support (MHPSS) activities through storytelling, songs, music, and cultural dances between various cultural groups to build social cohesion at the community level. IOM also organised theater activities to address issues relating to discrimination against persons with disabilities.

### Child Protection Sub-Working Group

**Needs:**

- There is a need to ensure that children are secure in safe spaces and adhere to COVID-19 prevention and mitigation guidelines.

**Response:**

- 70 children between 6 and 11 years old participated in Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) sessions conducted by IRC.
- Child protection screening was conducted by IRC at three outpatient sites in Michika, where 3 high risk cases requiring case management were recorded, and 13 with medium risk required follow-up.

### Gender-Based Violence Sub-Working Group

**Response:**

- Two new GBV cases were reported and documented within the week by IRC. Two cases of physical assault were supported with counseling and 1 case of psychological and emotional abuse was referred to Caritas for livelihood support. Follow-up was done on 5 cases of physical assault and 1 rape case.
- Plan International implementing partner staff from the Restoration of Hope Initiative (ROHI) registered 16 GBV cases linked to rape, denial of resources, physical assault, sexual assault, forced marriage, and psychological abuse) for case management services and also identified 2 GBV cases across 3 LGAs in Yola South, Yola North, and Girei.



## Water, Sanitation and Hygiene

**Needs:**

- Improved access to water supplies through water trucking, construction of new water points, rehabilitation, and operation and maintenance of broken-down water supply facilities (motorized/hand pump bore holes) in catchment communities in Michika and Askira Uba LGA is required.

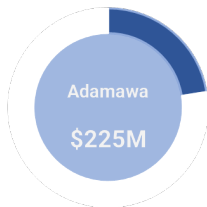
**Response:**

- IRC conducted water quality analysis for cholera response across 32 water points (29 contaminated and 3 within acceptable limits) across Girei, Yola North, and Yola South LGAs.
- IRC installed 10 chlorine dosing pumps across 4 primary healthcare centers (PHC) and 6 communities in Michika LGA.

- To further improve sanitation in IDP camps, IOM CCCM/WASH provided sanitation materials to IDPs at Wuro Yanka camp. Items include 2 gallons of Izal, 4 sackets of 2kg detergent, 11 brooms, 5 sets of hand-gloves, 6 pieces of reusable facemasks, 2 rubber dustbins, 1 water storage bucket, 2 shovels, 2 rakes and 2 hard brushes.

## Funding Overview

Out of \$1.0 billion required for the 2021 humanitarian response in north-east Nigeria, \$225 million is required for Adamawa State.
