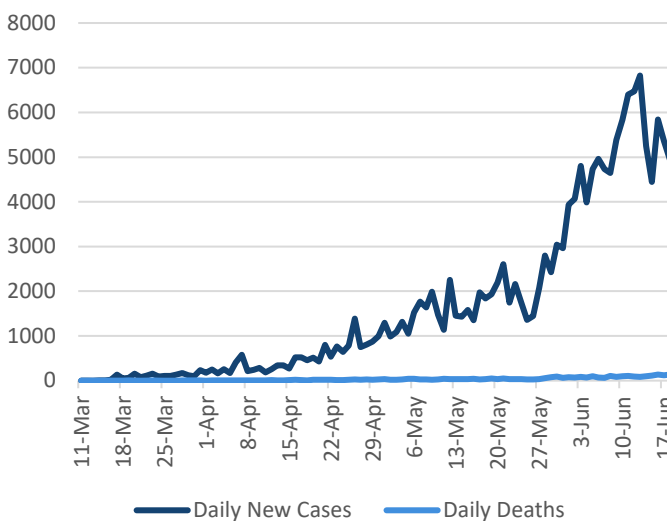

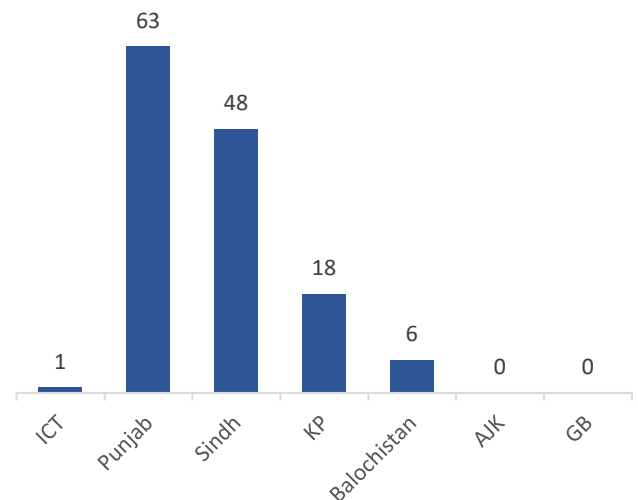
### HIGHLIGHTS

- The number of confirmed COVID-19 cases in Pakistan has risen to 165,062 as of 19th June. Increase of 4,944 new cases, and 136 deaths in the last 24 hours.
- The most affected province due to COVID-19 pandemic is Sindh 62,269 followed by Punjab 61,678.
- Drugs Regulatory Authority of Pakistan (DRAP) directed all federal and provincial drugs departments to ensure prescription based sale of Dexamethasone medicine for the critically ill COVID-19 patients.
- The federal government had decided to reopen 25% of its airspace after June 20 to bring back more Pakistanis stranded abroad because of the coronavirus pandemic.
- The federal government has extended visa validity of foreign nationals residing in Pakistan till August 31 in the wake of COVID-19 pandemic.
- The anti-locust operations had carried out in 324,609.69 square kilometers approximately 2.69 million acres across 42 affected districts of the country to eradicate the pests attack and to save agriculture land from its harmful impacts

Daily new cases & deaths

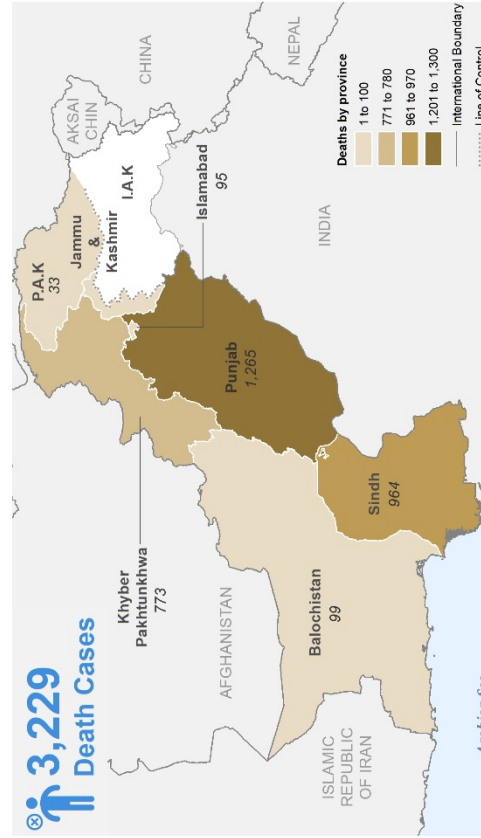
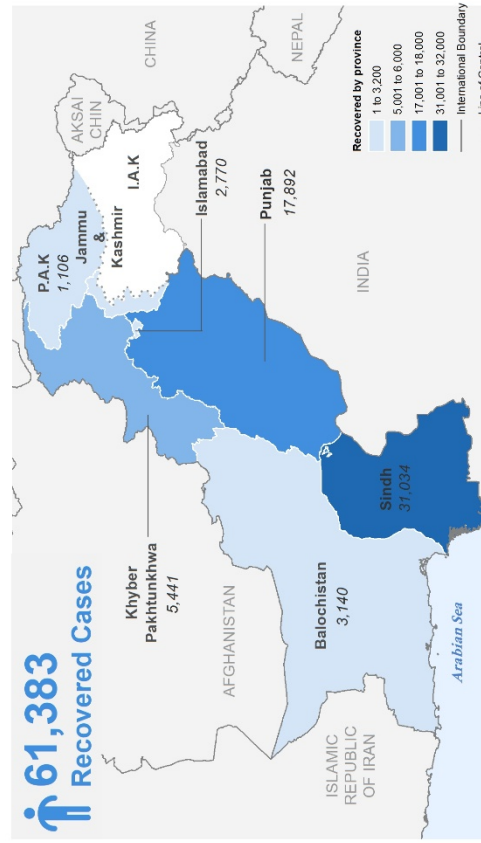
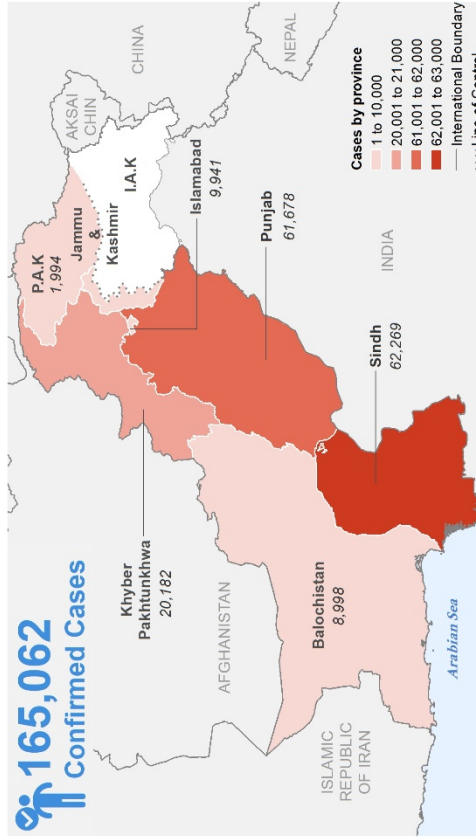
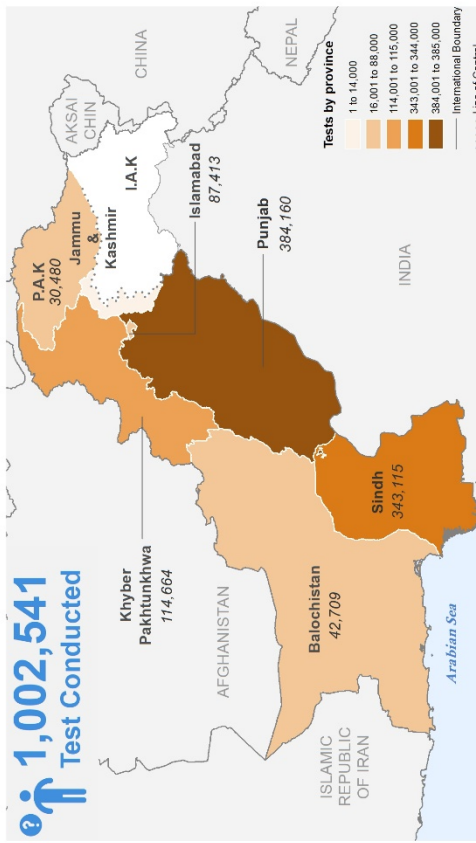


Deaths by province out of 136 deaths
