SITUATION OVERVIEW

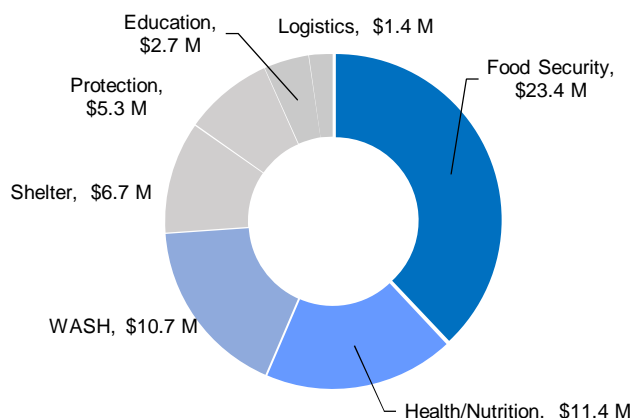
On 26 February 2018, a 7.5 magnitude earthquake hit the Highlands Region of Papua New Guinea (PNG), affecting an estimated 544,000 people in five provinces - Enga, Gulf, Hela, Southern Highlands and Western provinces, with Hela and Southern Highlands the most affected. More than 270,000 people including 125,000 children, have been left in immediate need of life saving assistance. Since the initial 26 February earthquake, at least 270 aftershocks have occurred, of which six were of a 6.0 or greater magnitude.

The results of a mobile Vulnerability Assessment Mapping (mVAM) survey conducted in late March indicate that 14 per cent households in earthquake-affected areas were displaced, while the latest Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM) figures indicate that 11,041 households (42, 577 people) remain displaced due to the earthquake, of which 1,252 households (24 per cent) are in nine care centres and 9, 789 households remain displaced within their home communities.

In addition to damaged and destroyed housing, health facilities and schools, the destruction of food gardens affected the main livelihood and food supply source for a majority of affected people, leading to food insecurity for an estimated 153, 000 people. The partial assessment of key social infrastructure (primarily focusing on health and education facilities) in Hela, Southern Highlands and Western provinces concluded that the estimated cost of rehabilitating assessed social infrastructure across the three provinces is approximately US\$ 105 million. This does not include rehabilitating road infrastructure for earth-quake affected sections of the Highlands Highway.

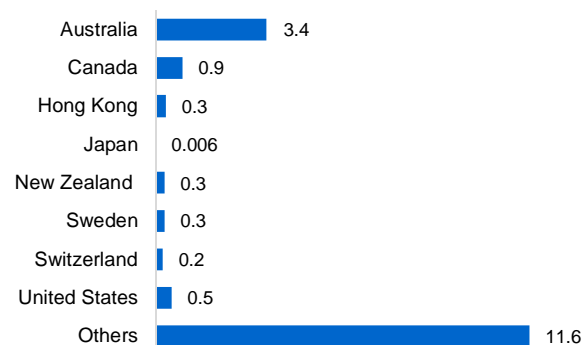
REQUIREMENTS BY CLUSTER

Food Security

Response to date

- 91 157 persons of targeted beneficiaries have been reached with food assistance. 33 913 (WFP), 7 975 (CARE), 34 520 (OSL), 12 500 (EMPNG) and 2 249 (ADRA)
- 1,061 households of targeted households have received agricultural inputs. 161 (FAO) and (900) EMPNG
- EMPNG distributed 39,000 sweet potato vines, 194,000 cassava cuttings, 20 KG of OP corn seeds and approx. 900 spades to Yarale, Timu, Beneria, Mulako, Tamita and Pakale, Nigiria, Parapu, and Kulu in Hela province.

- 29 health facilities have received staff-surge support
- 4,900 women (15-49 years) who are reached with information on life saving behaviours and available services (Minimum Initial Service Package)
- 78 health workers trained in sexual, reproductive health in emergencies and GBV (Minimum Initial Service Package - MISP)
- 226 health workers trained in mental and psycho-social health
- 1800 dignity, reproductive health and other essential protection and hygiene supplies distributed to health centres at priority LLGs.
- 69,600 pregnant and lactating women counselled on infant and young child feeding (IYFC).
- 16,448 children have received at least one dose of measles-rubella (MR) vaccine.

Response to date

- 20 government, local authorities, private sector and NGOs staff trained on DTM are planned to be trained in Mendi and Nipa in July.
- 1,887 households (approx. 9,353 people) of displaced households have received shelter assistance as of 30 June. 145 persons trained on BBS as of 30 June.
- Round 1 DTM completed and sex age disaggregated data available for 41 displacement sites. Round 2 is ongoing from May.



Protection

Response to date

- 110 community-based workers trained in emergency psychosocial support and to provide support to GBV survivors, children and sorcery-related accusation as of 10 July.
- 10 functioning safe spaces for women and children established across 7 most affected LLGs in Hela and SHP as of 10 July.
- 3 communications modalities employed for reaching out to community members including sms blasts, audio messaging, counseling hotline, and community-outreach campaigns by community mobilisers as of 10 July.



Education

Cluster Indicators

- Number of children (3-14 years) who are enrolled in non-formal/formal education, including early learning and received learning materials (Cluster Target: 15,000)
- Number of teachers reached with teaching kits and training support (cluster Target: 5,000)

Response to date

- 8,674 children (4,823 boys and 3,851 girls (3-14 years old) have benefited from 20 established safe temporary learning spaces and child-friendly spaces
- Teaching kits are inbound and yet to arrive in country. Training support will be rolled out simultaneously once teaching kits are in country.
