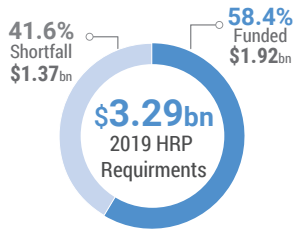

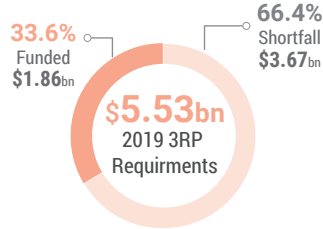

- Lebanon's total needs reflect the total requirements of the LCRP 2019. The Lebanon Inter-Agency Appeal reflects UN and NGO requirements within the LCRP. The refugee and resilience breakdown is an estimate based on the overall sector appeal.
- The Jordan Inter-Agency Appeal refers to the United Nations and NGO appeal in areas where they have a comparative advantage to leverage funding to support the Government of Jordan's JRP.
- This funding includes donor commitments and contributions towards the Syria Humanitarian Response Plan 2019 and the Syria regional refugee and resilience plan (3RP) 2019, as well as contributions outside these frameworks (to UN agencies, NGOs or the Red Cross/Red Crescent Movement) in Syria and neighbouring countries, as reported to FTS and UNHCR.
- Agreements for funding managed by the European Union Facility for Refugees in Turkey including funding from the European Union Humanitarian Aid (ECHO) and the European Union Regional Trust Fund in Response to the Syrian Crisis to agencies in Turkey in the final stages of discussion as at 31 October 2017 and therefore have not yet been signed. Funding is based on the exchange rate as of 31 October 2017 and will be adjusted when agreements have been signed.
- Includes funding from the European Commission's Humanitarian Aid and Civil Protection Department, European Commission EuropeAid Development and Cooperation, European Commission.
- "Protection" includes "Child Protection AoR", "Gender-Based Violence AoR" and "Mine Action AoR".
