- \$5.57 billion includes \$943 million of multi-year funds already received for 2017, making the total 2017 unmet requirements \$4.63 billion appealed for under the 3RP. (UNHCR, January 2017)
- Lebanon's total needs reflect the total requirements of the Lebanon Crisis Response Plan (LCRP) 2017. The Lebanon Inter-Agency Appeal reflects UN and NGO requirements within the LCRP, including the estimated \$135,681,345 of multi-year funding already received for 2017.
- The Jordan Response Plan 2017 and 2018 figures are based on the Jordan Response Plan 2017 – 2019 endorsed at the JRP Platform meeting on 12 January 2017. The Jordan Inter-Agency Appeal refers to the United Nations and NGO appeal in area where they have a comparative advantage to leverage funding to support the Government of Jordan. The above-mentioned Inter-Agency budgets are estimates as of 15 January 2017 and requires a non-objection by the Government of Jordan. The inter-agency appeal listed above includes the estimated \$7,000,000 of multi-year funding already received for 2017.
- Egypt total needs also includes the Government of Egypt requirements under the Education and Health Sectors.
- The Turkey Inter-Agency Appeal reflects UN and NGO requirements, including the estimated USD 800,000,000 of multi-year funding already received for 2017.
- This funding includes donor commitments and contributions towards the Syria Humanitarian Response Plan 2017 and the Syria regional refugee and resilience plan (3RP) 2017, as well as contributions outside these frameworks (to UN agencies, NGOs or the Red Cross/Red Crescent Movement) in Syria and neighbouring countries, as reported to FTS and UNHCR.
- The Facility for Refugees in Turkey coordinates a total of Eur 3 billion for humanitarian and development assistance for refugees and host-communities in Turkey. Eur 1 billion is financed from the EU budget (ECHO, NEAR, FPI) and the remaining Eur 2 billion by contributions from the 28 Member States according to their share in EU GNI.
