Subject: **SOUTHWEST MONSOON-2011: DAILY FLOOD SITUATION REPORT**

**SUMMARY OF IMPORTANT EVENTS AS ON 26.07.2011**

**RAINFALL/FLOOD SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY**

- Moderate to heavy rainfall with isolated very heavy falls have been reported in some parts of Lakshadweep, Andhra Pradesh, Maharashtra, Goa, Karnataka & Assam.

**Indian Meteorological Department (Major features of weather forecast)**

- Fairly widespread rain/thundershowers would occur over western Himalayan region, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, northeastern states, Maharashtra, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, south Chhattisgarh, Kerala, Lakshadweep and Andaman & Nicobar islands.
- Scattered rain/thundershowers would occur over remaining parts of the country outside west Rajasthan and rest east India where it would be isolated. However, rainfall activity would increase over plains of northwest, central and east India after 24 hours.

**CENTRAL WATER COMMISSION (daily water levels and forecasts for level forecast sites)**

- There are 09 Moderate flood situation sites (Assam-03, Bihar-03 & Uttar Pradesh-03) in the country on 26.07.2011.

**DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF)**

- 16 teams consisting of 543 personnel of NDRF have been deployed in Assam - (6), Andhra Pradesh - (2), J&K - (2), Kerala - (1), and Bihar (5).

## **INDIAN METEOROLOGICAL DEPARTMENT (daily weather report)**

- Fairly widespread rain/thundershowers would occur over western Himalayan region, Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim, northeastern states, Maharashtra, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, south Chhattisgarh, Kerala, Lakshadweep and Andaman & Nicobar islands.
- Scattered rain/thundershowers would occur over remaining parts of the country outside west Rajasthan and rest east India where it would be isolated. However, rainfall activity would increase over plains of northwest, central and east India after 24 hours.

### **Warning**

- Isolated heavy rainfall would occur over Jammu Division of Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Konkan & Goa and coastal Karnataka during next 48 hours.

### **Weather outlook for next two days**

- Fairly widespread rainfall would occur over many parts of the country except Gangetic West Bengal, Orissa, Saurashtra & Kutch, west Rajasthan and Tamilnadu where it may be scattered or isolated.

## **CENTRAL WATER COMMISSION (daily water levels and forecasts for level at forecast sites)**

According to the Central Water Commission (CWC) report dated 26<sup>th</sup> July, 2011, there are 09 moderate flood situation sites in the country, as per details given below:

### **Moderate Flood Site** **Assam**

- River Brahmaputra at Neamatighat/Jorhat (Assam) is flowing at 85.44 m against the danger level of 85.04 m with Falling trend.
- River Brahmaputra at Dhubri (Assam) is flowing at 28.84 m against the danger level of 28.62m with Falling trend.
- River Dhansiri(S) at Numaligarh/Golaghat (Assam) is flowing at 77.99m against the danger level of 77.42m with Falling trend.

### **Bihar**

- River Bagmati at Muzafferpur/Hayaghat (Bihar) is flowing at 48.75 m against the danger level of 48.68m with a Falling trend.
- River Kamtaul at Darbhanga/Kamtaul (Bihar) is flowing at 50.80m against the danger level of 50.00m with a Steady trend.
- River Kosi at Khagaria/Choutham(Bihar) is flowing at 34.47m against the danger level of 33.85m with a Steady trend.

## **Uttar Pradesh**

- River Ganga at Ballia(Uttar Pradesh) is flowing at 57.75m against the danger level of 57.62 m with a Rising trend.
- River Ghaghra at Barabanki(Uttar Pradesh) is flowing at 106.23m against the danger level of 106.07 m with a Falling trend.
- River Ghaghra at Faizabad/Ayodhya(Uttar Pradesh) is flowing at 93.04 m against the danger level of 92.73 m with a Steady trend.

## **DEPLOYMENT OF NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE FORCE (NDRF) ON 26<sup>th</sup> July, 2011**

- ❖ In Assam, 06 teams consisting of 180 personnel in Kamrup(18), Dhubri (33), Lakhimpur (31), Sonitpur (33), Jorhat (30) and Dhemaji (35) alongwith equipment have been deployed for emergent response and rescue operations in case of any flood or any other disaster.
- ❖ In Andhra Pradesh, 02 teams consisting of 66 personnel in Vijayawada have been deployed alongwith equipment to provide emergency response during flood situation.
- ❖ In Kerala, 01 team consisting of 37 personnel in Kozhikode deployed alongwith equipment to provide emergency response during flood situation.
- ❖ In Jammu & Kashmir, 02 teams consisting of 90 personnel in Baltal (43) and Pahlgam(47)deployed alongwith equipment to provide emergency response during flood situation.
- ❖ In Bihar, 05 teams consisting of 170 personnel in Saharsa (28), Madhepura (35), Supaul (35), Khagaria (32) and Gopalganj (40) deployed alongwith equipment to provide emergency response during flood situation.
