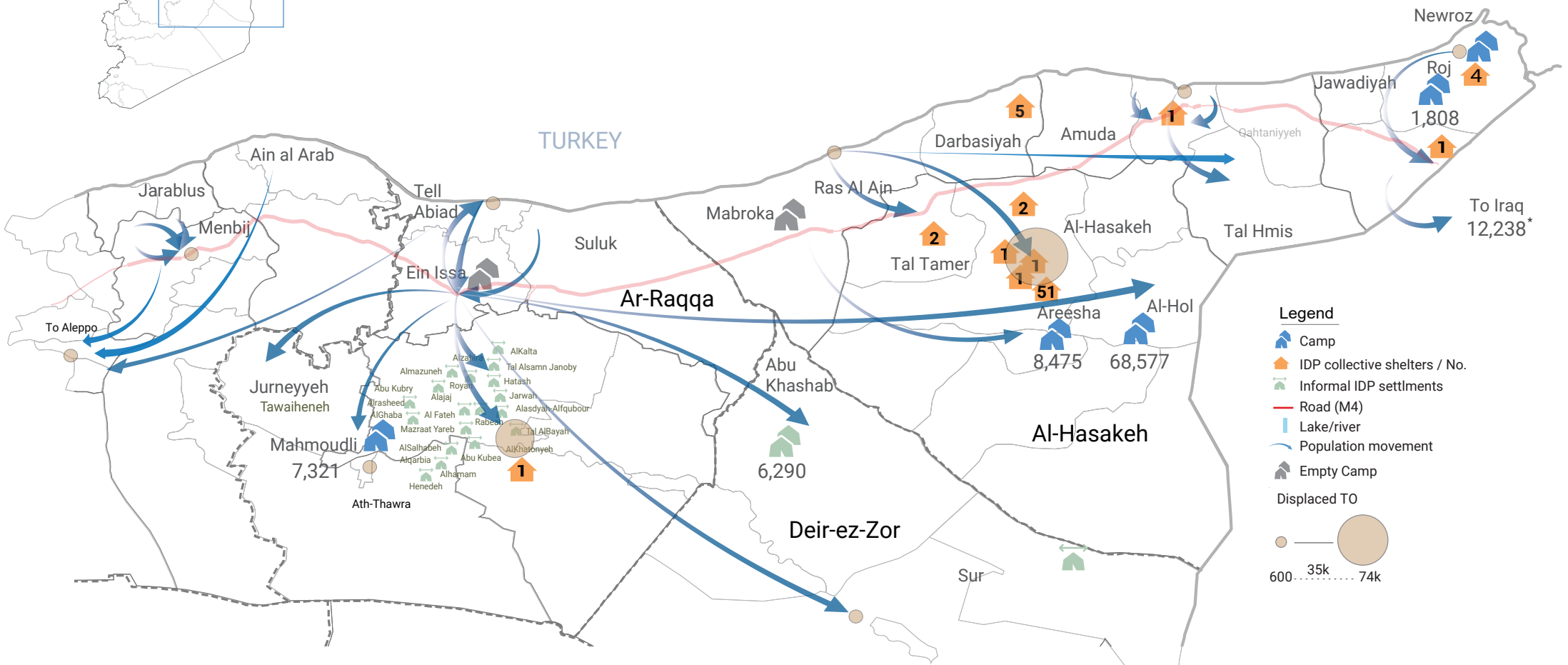
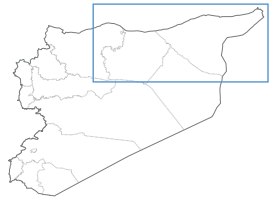

OVERVIEW

The onset of military operations in Northeast Syria by the Turkish army and allied non-state groups on 9 October has forced huge numbers of people to flee their homes. Around **105,574** remain displaced as of 28 October, and an additional **96,855** people were displaced and have since returned. Of those currently displaced, **98,798** are from Al Hassakeh and Ar Raqqa, and **6,776** are from Aleppo. Displaced people are finding shelter with friends and family and also in informal settlements and collective shelters. There are **69** such shelters in Al Hasakeh Governorate alone. Over 12,200 people have reportedly been displaced into neighboring Iraq. Prior to 9 October, Northeast Syria already hosted a total of 710,000 people displaced from earlier phases of the conflict, around 91,000 of whom remain in Al Hol, Areesha, Mahmoudi, Newroz and Roj camps.

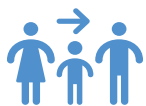

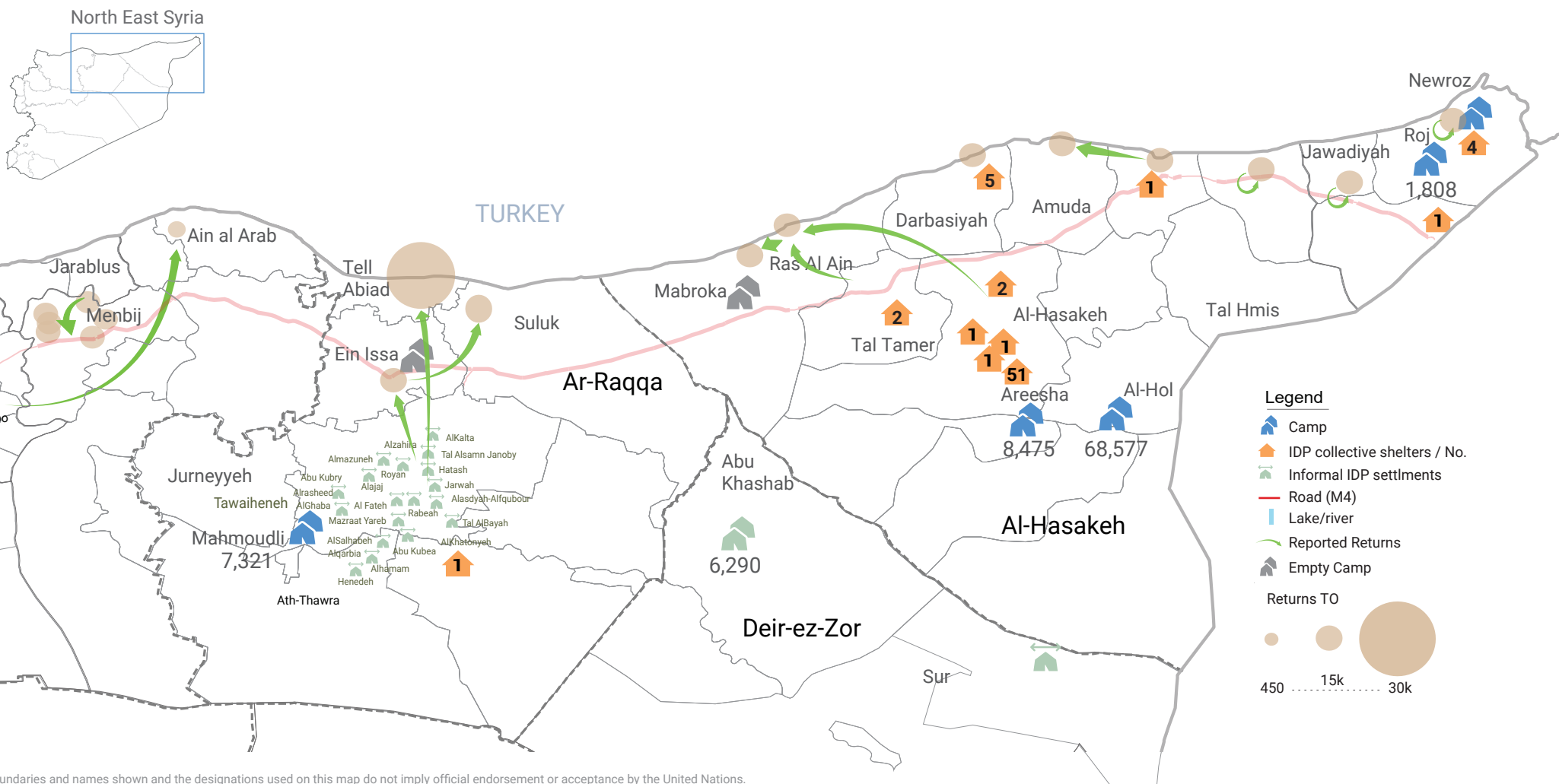

OVERVIEW

An estimated **96,855** people who were displaced after 9 October are reported to have returned to their places of origin. Of these, **86,750** have returned to Al Hassakeh and Ar-Raqqa: 17,500 to Qamishli, 8,200 to Al-Malikeyyeh, 22,050 to Ras Al Ain and 39,000 to Tal Abyad in Ar-Raqqa.

In Aleppo **10,105** have returned mainly to Menbij
