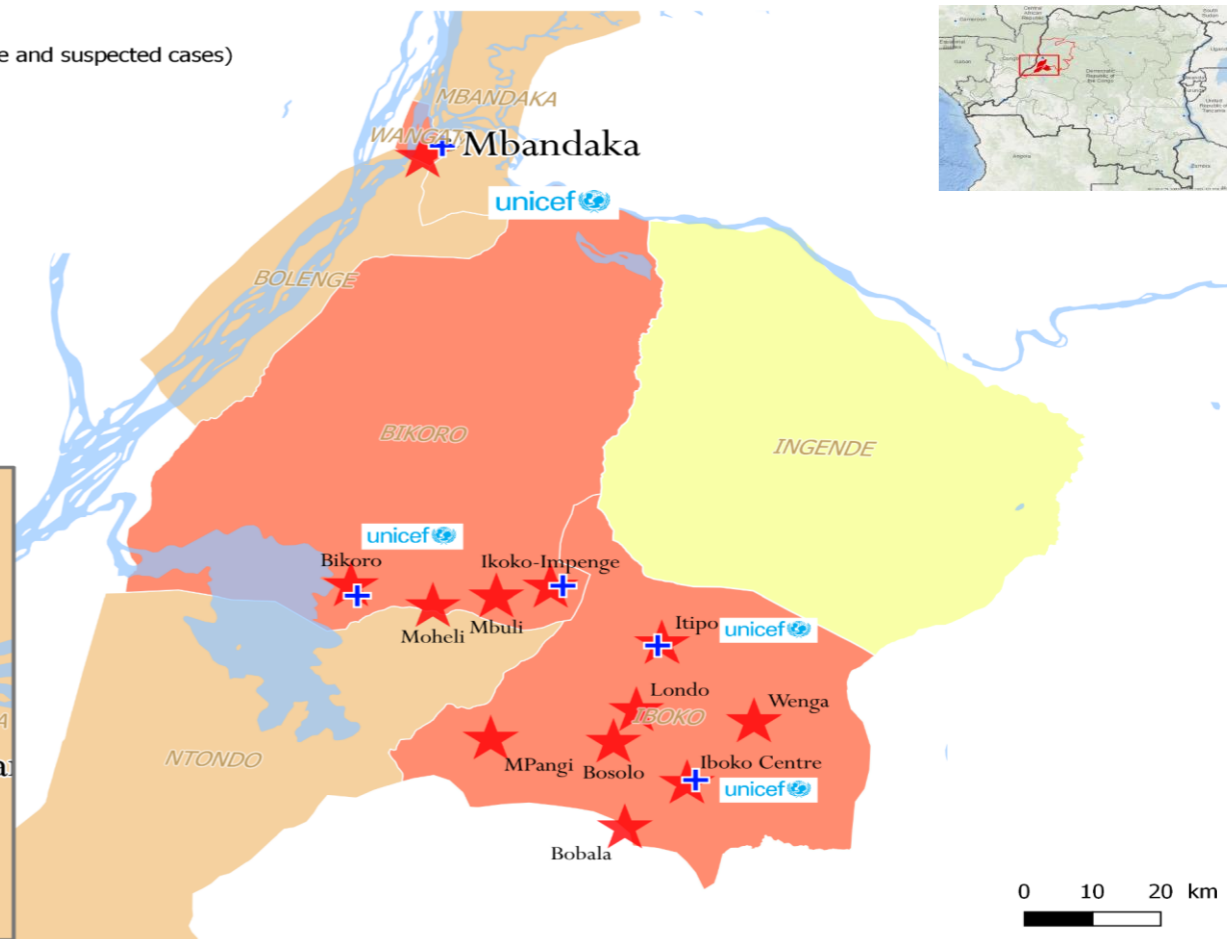
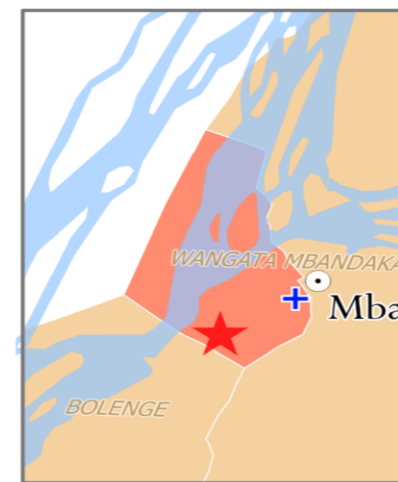
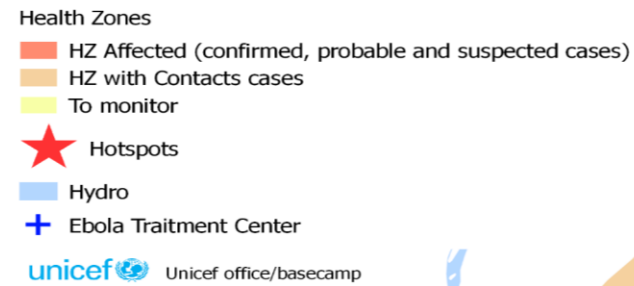
UNICEF participates actively in the coordination mechanisms at national, provincial and local level and is active in the working groups on communication, WASH, psychosocial care and logistics. UNICEF co-chairs the national Social Mobilization and communication; WASH and psychosocial care commissions.

Affected Health Zones

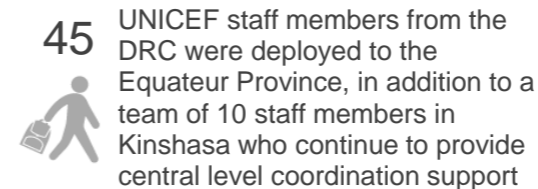
