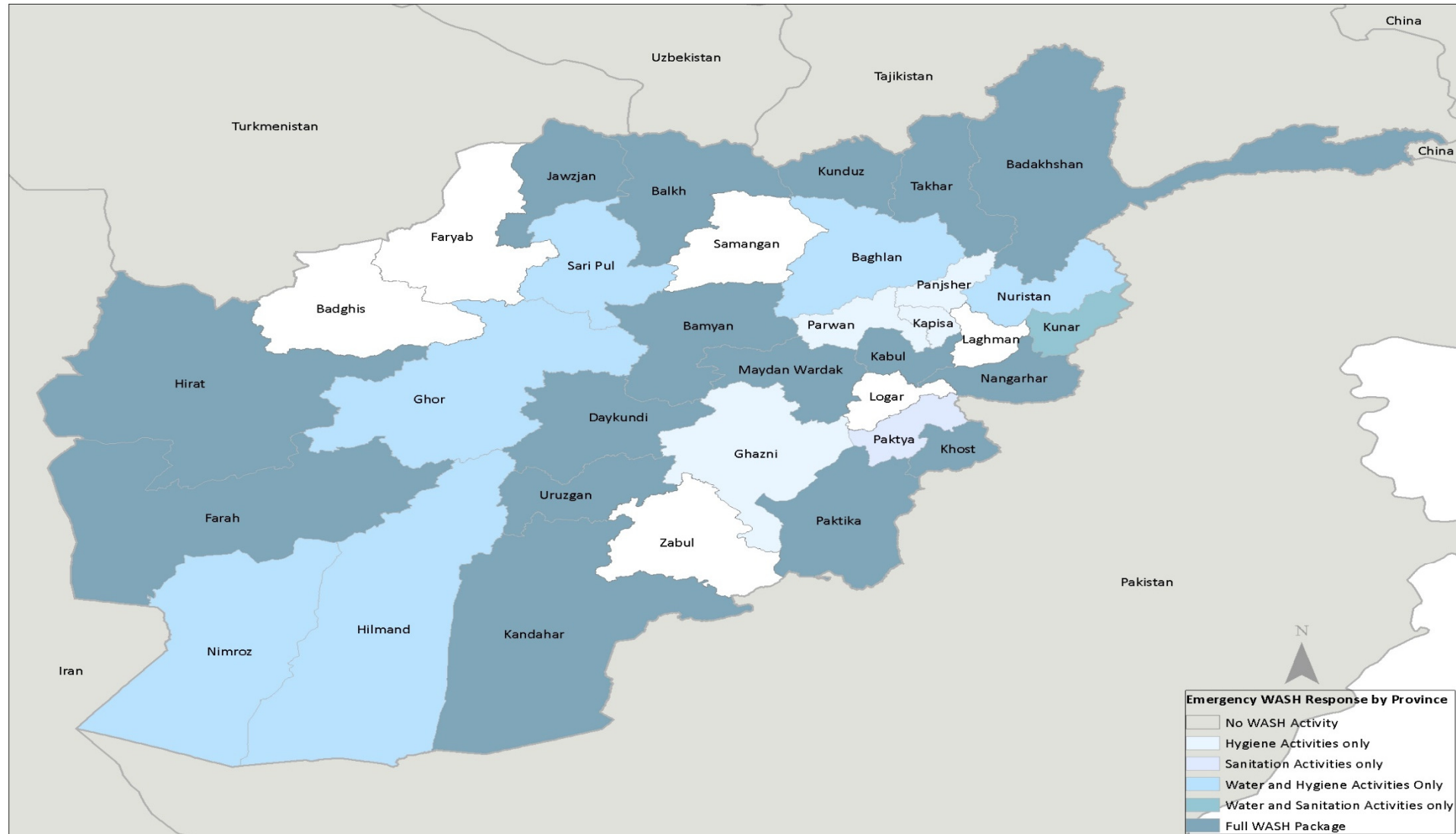


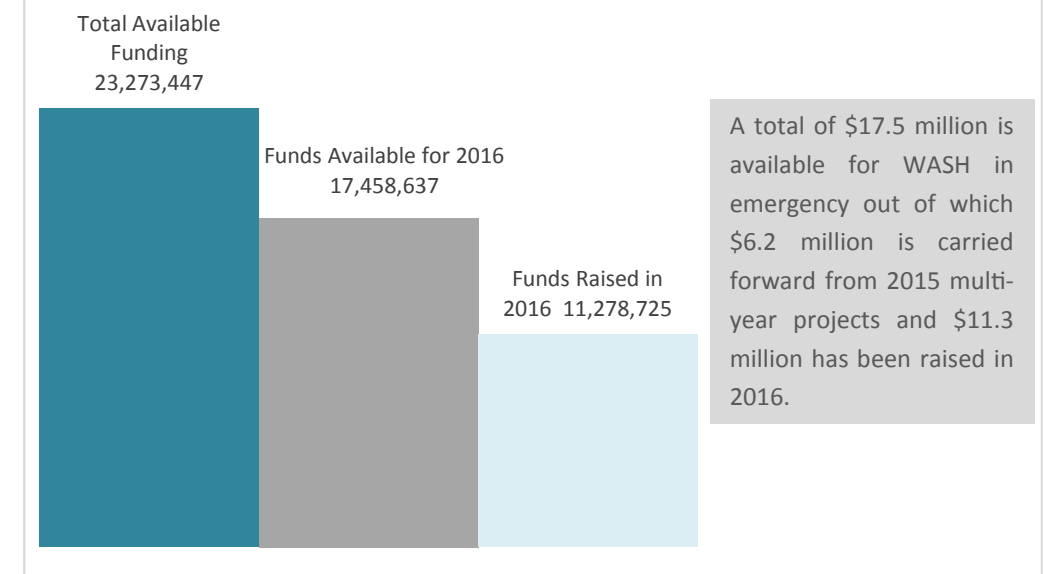
The Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) remains one of the challenging development and humanitarian issues in Afghanistan. Limited access to WASH means a significant burden of poor health, nutrition, education and protection for children and women. The Humanitarian Response Plan (HRP) envisaged a need for reaching 0.90 million people with WASH response in 2016. The Cluster partners have successfully reached more than 682,780 people during the January to end of September 2016. Despite this, there are a significant number of people whose humanitarian WASH needs remained unattended, especially those of conflict affected IDPs living in districts and provinces with limited access to humanitarian agencies due to security concerns. There is a need for continuous engagement of WASH cluster with relevant stakeholders in finding the ways and means to reach those needy population with appropriate WASH response in the upcoming months.



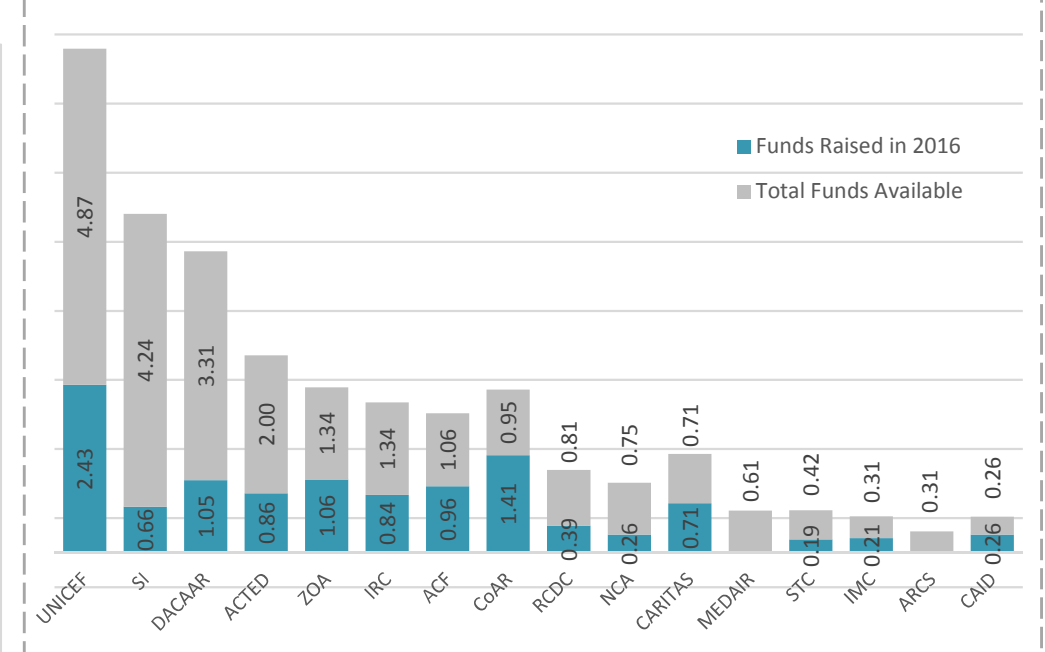

Overall Cluster Funding Status (USD)



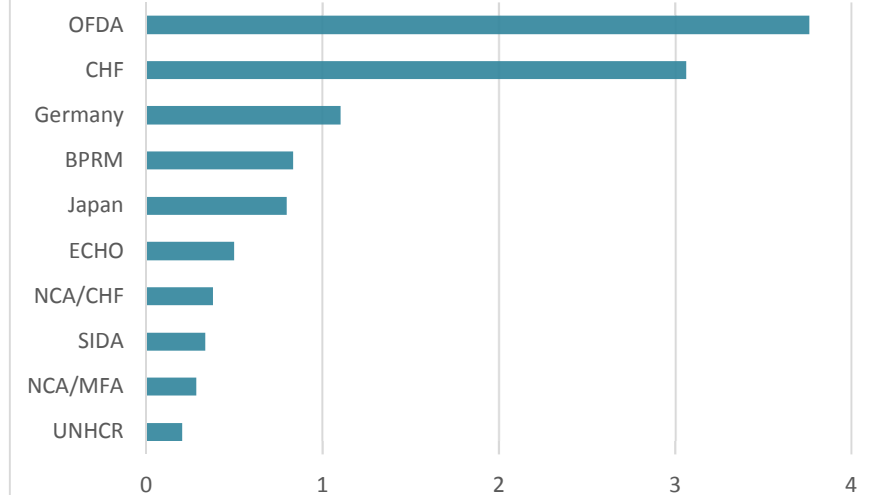
2016 Funding Status by Organisation USD (Millions)



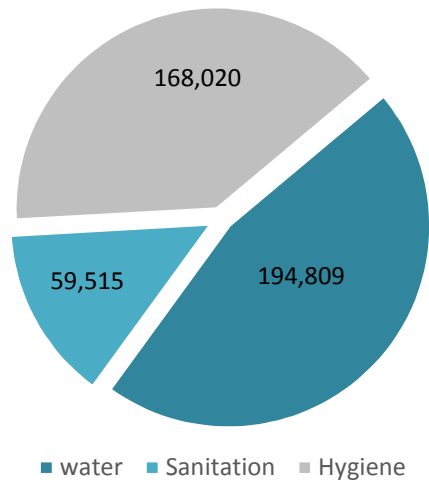

Emergency WASH funding received in 2016 by Donor in USD (millions)

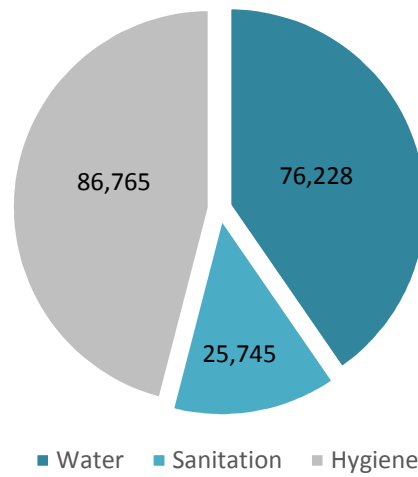


IDPs Newly Displaced by Conflict Reached with WASH



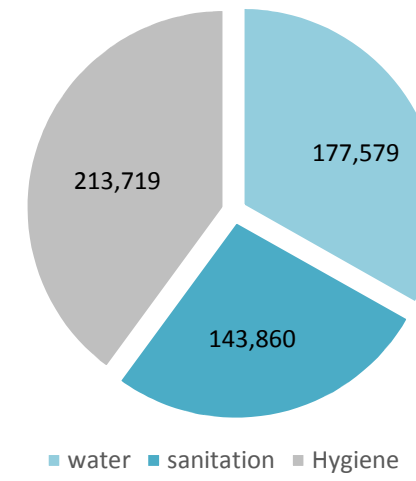
Out of **269,568** newly displaced IDP beneficiaries **72%** were reached with Water Supply, **22%** with Sanitation & **62%** with Hygiene

Host Communities Reached with WASH



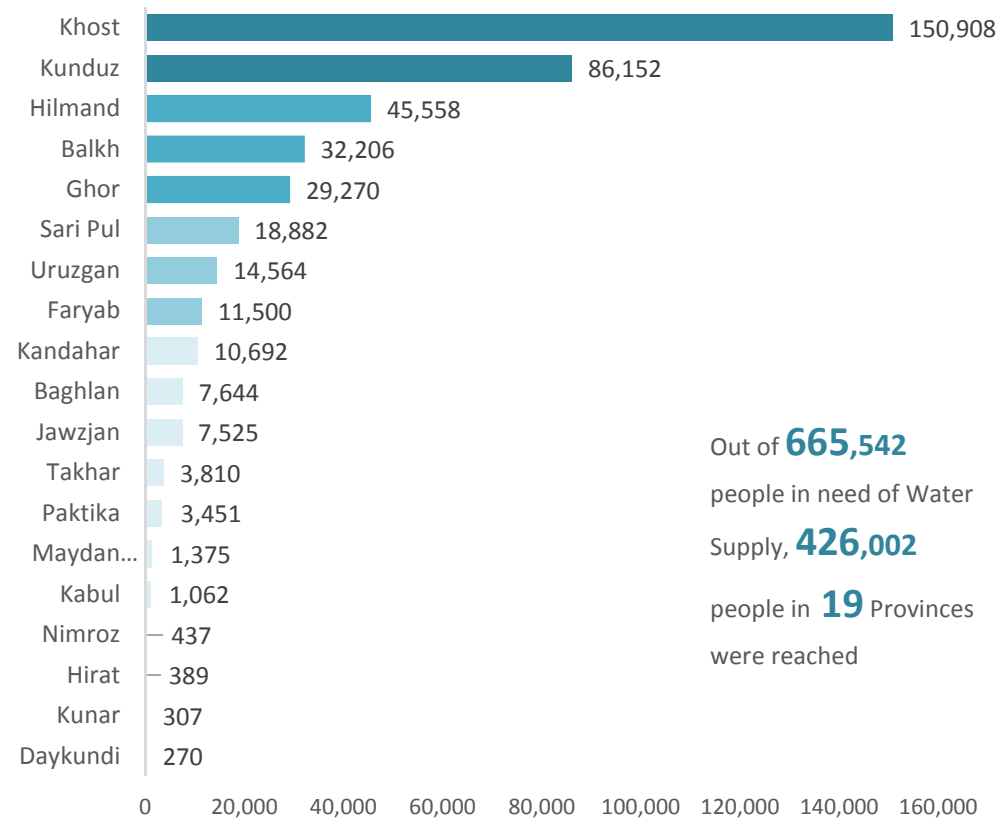
Out of **96,854** Host Community beneficiaries **79%** were reached with Water Supply, **27%** with Sanitation & **90%** with Hygiene

Refugees and Returnees Reached with WASH



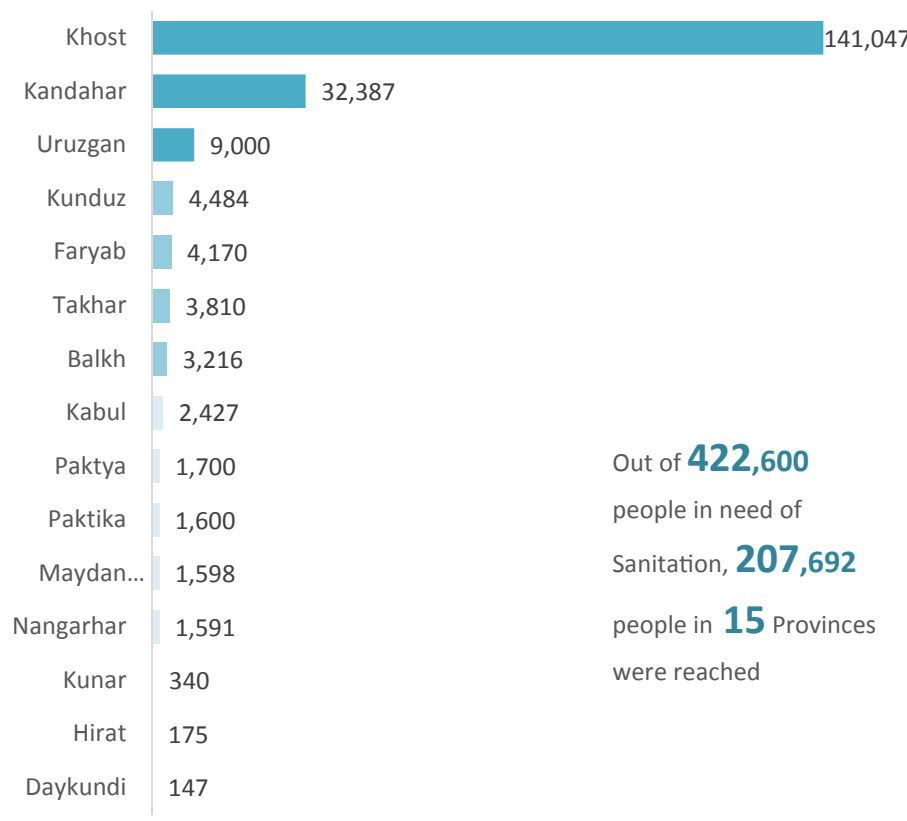
Out of **253,000** Refugees & Returnees beneficiaries **70%** were reached with Water Supply, **57%** with Sanitation & **84%** with Hygiene

HRP Target Beneficiaries Reached with Water Supply



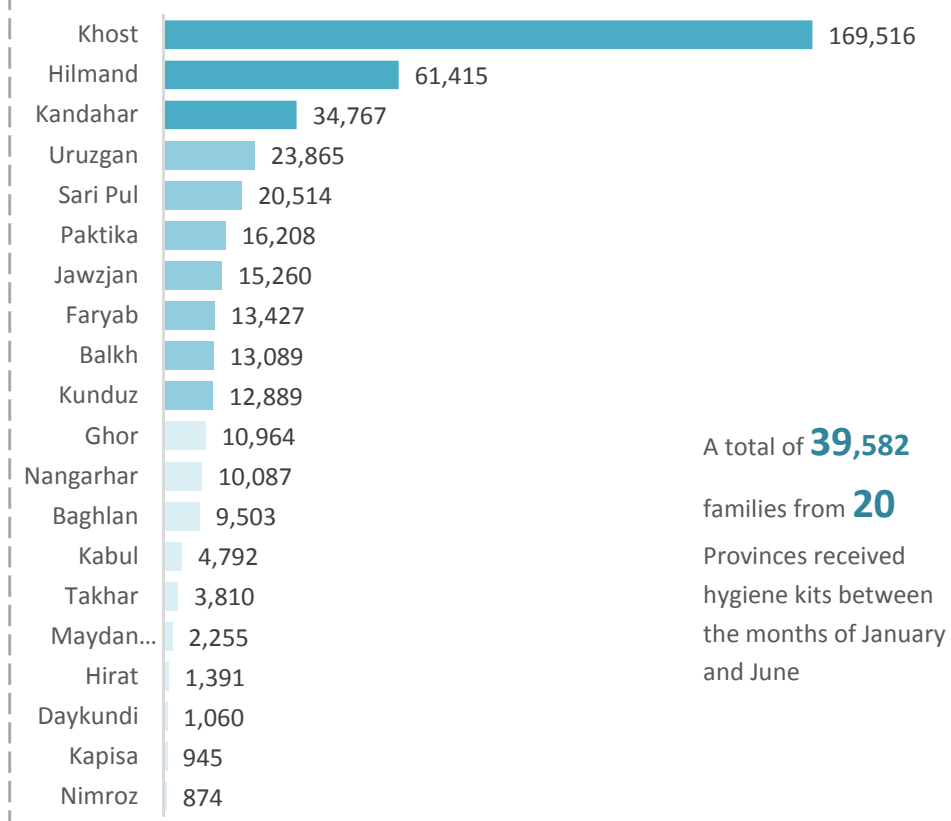
Out of **665,542** people in need of Water Supply, **426,002** people in **19** Provinces were reached
